BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENTS TO ENTER HITS DEL MAR DRESSAGE

****MUST BE SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY AT LEAST 24 HOURS PRIOR TO ARRIVAL**** EMAIL TO: DelMarHealth@HITSShows.com

HITS Del Mar takes all precautions regarding the health, welfare and safety of all exhibitors, both equine and human. We are counting on every one's cooperation with the protocols we have put in place to run a safe horse show for all.

THE FOLLOWING FOUR ITEMS ARE MANDATORY, AND MUST BE COMPLETED AT LEAST 24 HOURS PRIOR TO ARRIVAL.

1.) **VACCINATION RECORD:** Proof of vaccination for both Equine Influenza and Rhinopneumonitis within six months of entering the grounds must be submitted. If submitted on a letter from a veterinarian, it must show the date given as well as the date of vaccine administration. If given by someone other than a vet, proof must be submitted on a USEF vaccination form-available on the USEF website-and must include the type of vaccine, serial number and date given.

2.) **DECLARATION OF HEALTH:** The declaration below must be signed to confirm that all horses entering the grounds have been in good health, with no sign of infectious disease and have not had a fever above 101.5 **within the past 14 days**. Signing this form confirms that the horses listed are not demonstrating any signs of EHV-1, have not had any exposure to EHV-1 in 21 days and are not coming from a property with known EHV-1 positive cases.

3) **COGGINS:** Coggins is only required from horses arriving from out of the state of California.

Failure to submit the required documentation will result in horses not being permitted on the showgrounds.

Entries: Accepted on a first come, first serve basis by on-line entry only, see below. One entry per horse/rider combination.

On-Line Entries: Visit **Equestrian-Hub.com** opening day. **Required documents** are the **USEF Entry Agreement**-requires signatures for everyone listed on the entry (see page 14 for the definition of a Trainer and Coach on the entry) and current **Flu/Rhino vaccination** records. These documents may be uploaded in Equestrian-hub and submitted with the show entry or e-mailed separately to the Show Secretary. You must also provide the **USEF Waiver and Release of Liability Form** for each person listed on the entry. These Waivers may be uploaded in Equestrian-hub and submitted with the show entry or e-mailed separately to the Show Secretary. Entries without current, correct and required association number verification will be considered incomplete and the membership verification fee applies for each entry.

PLEASE NOTE, the USEF Entry Agreement and USEF Waiver and Release of Liability Form may be found on the last 2 pages of this document.

Management requires that all entries be created on Equestrian-Hub.com. If you do not already have a user account with Black Horse GmbH please sign up for an account prior to starting an entry. You may pay on-line with a credit card or mail a check to the Show Secretary for the total entry fees. If you choose to pay on-line, there is a processing fee.

If paying with a check you must inform the Show Secretary that you have created an entry in Equestrian-Hub and will be mailing a check for the entry fees which must be received before the closing date.

Each competitor is responsible for supplying show management with the correct, current and required association numbers of USEF and USDF for the horse, owner, rider/handler, trainer and coach (trainer and coach are exempt from USDF membership requirements), with their on-line entry. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct and active numbers may not count towards national awards.

Any fees incorrectly charged to the entry and paid for with Equestrian-hub will be refunded to the credit card used for the entry.

No telephone, mail, fax or e-mail entries will be accepted. ALL FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ON-LINE ENTRIES OR A CHECK MUST BE MAILED TO THE SHOW SECRETARY. Entries without payment in full will not be accepted.

On-line Entries must be received by midnight on July 5, 2024. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted with a \$50 late entry fee per entry on a space-available basis.

Only one horse/rider combination per entry form.

PAPERLESS ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This includes current and active memberships, all required entry signatures for owner, rider, trainer and coach, flu/rhino vaccination records (and negative Coggins if coming from out of state) as well as USEF waivers for all those named on the entry form. The Show Secretary must receive all necessary documentation by Friday, July 12, 2024, via e-mail.

COVID-19 Safety Precautions: CDS San Diego will comply with the guidelines regarding COVID-19 as set forth by USEF and the State of California at the time of the show.

Non-Compete Horses: Non-compete horses will be allowed as space permits.

Hauling In Horses: Will be permitted as long as there are no outbreaks at time of event.

California Coggins/Health Certificate Law: Equine entering California: All equine entering California must be accompanied by a current negative Coggins test for EIA conducted within 12 months of the show date, flu/rhino vaccinations within 6 months of the show date. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of entry into the state.

For Dressage Competitions, any documentation such as negative EIA certification (Coggins) that is required for entry to a competition must list the same horse name and description as is listed on the entry blank and on the USEF horse identification or recording documents. USEF GR906.4

USEF Equine Vaccination Rule: Per USEF GR844 Equine Vaccination Rule; All equine entering this competition must provide with their entry, proof of current flu/rhino vaccinations within 6 months of the show BUT should be no later than 7 days before the show. If providing proof of vaccinations from your veterinarian it must be on the veterinarian's letterhead. E-mails without an attached letter from a veterinarian will not be accepted.

For horses entering the state, the Show Secretary must receive a negative Coggins along with proof of vaccinations. Documents for a horse residing in state or entering the state must be received before check-in day or the horse will not be allowed on the property.

TRAINER, as listed on the entry form, is defined as an adult (18 years of age & older) who has responsibility for the care, custody or performance of the horse while the horse is on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as trainer.

COACH, as listed on the entry form, is defined as an adult or adults (18 years of age & older) who receives remuneration (gets paid) for having or sharing the responsibility for instructing, teaching, schooling, or advising a rider, driver, handler, or vaulter in equestrian skills. GR108 This adult must sign the entry form as coach.

EFFECTIVE 12/1/2022

USEF Show Pass (non-member) Rules GR202 GR205 GR206:

- Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for a Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors.
- Non-member participants in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.
- To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing.
- The online Show Pass form is available on the USEF website at USEF.org/show-pass.
- The Show Pass can only be purchased within 14 days of the show date.
- Show Passes must be purchased **DIRECTLY** from the USEF website prior to entering the show.
- Entries in Introductory and Opportunity classes are exempt from requiring a Show Pass.

Credit Cards: Credit cards will be accepted during the show for on-line purchases of shavings and hay in the show office.

Returned Checks or Declined Credit Cards: Checks returned by the bank or declined credit cards will be charged a penalty of \$50.00 or 10% of the face value of the declined amount, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full with cash or equivalent. Checks will NOT be deposited a second time. See USEF GR912 Unpaid Entries.

Show Office: Will be open daily beginning Wednesday at 9 am. Daily 90 minutes prior to start of first class

Results: Results can be found on Equestrian-Hub.com and will be posted by show office as well.

Great American Insurance Group/USDF Qualifying Classes: Qualifying classes will not require a separate ride. All exhibitors riding in the Open, Adult Amateur, & Junior/Young Rider classes will pay an additional \$15 USDF fee to have this score entered for the USDF qualifying class at that level. No separate ribbons or prizes will be awarded. Please add the additional \$15 to the on-line entry form for the qualifying class.

Important Notice to All Affected Parties: Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facility where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings. If said parties fail to observe any COVID-19 Guidelines in effect at the time of the competition, they will be asked to immediately leave the show grounds.

Pony Riders/Pony Measurement: If you don't have a measurement card for the pony, you must notify the Show Secretary by e-mail. You will need to schedule an appointment to have this done prior to your first pony test and are required to pay the veterinarian fee charged, if any, for this service. Pony measurements will take place on Wednesday, July 17th. The competitor will be notified of their appointment time. A pony does not exceed 148 cm without shoes and 149 cm with shoes. Any pony competing in classes limited to ponies must submit a copy of a USEF Measurement Card with the entry.

Confirmation/Times: Unofficial ride times and show updates will be posted no later than the Monday prior to the horse show at Equestrian-Hub.com. An equestrian-hub confirmation email will come to you once your entry is processed. E-mail addresses are required and must be active.

Management reserves the right to change the time schedule after tentative times have been posted. A list of final ride times will be available at <https://Equestrian-Hub.com>. This show follows USEF GR830 with regard to rescheduled ride times.

Entry Cancellation/Refunds: Office fee is not refundable. Entries with written cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the \$60 office fee.

NO REFUNDS after Closing Date even if Closing Date is extended; includes Acts of God, Accidents, Emergencies and Pandemics.

Scratches During Show: Competitors have the responsibility to inform the Show Secretary by text or phone call of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Scratches can be accepted at the competition arena with the Ring Steward but the competitor or representative must send a text to the Show Secretary at 317.501.5161 or call after securing their horse to officially scratch their ride. If texting or calling is a problem come to the show office to speak with the Show Secretary. Scratched rides are not refundable.

Adding a Class During the Show from a Scratched Ride: Competitors may fill a scratched ride during the competition but must contact the Show Secretary first. Payment for an added class will be made by credit card in the office. A post entry fee will be added to these classes entered during the show.

Show Schedule and Ride Time Conflicts: It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the Show Secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.

Show Program: The program for this show is in an electronic format and can be found at SanDiegoDressage.com/ and HITSShows.com

Protective Headgear: DR120.1.1 Protective Headgear. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration. See DR136 for dress code rules for exhibitions.

Waiving of Coats: DR120.2. Weather Conditions. In locations with high average heat and humidity on the date of a competition, competition management may publish in its prize list that jackets will be waived for the duration of the competition. Alternatively, management may announce prior to or during a competition that competitors may show without jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecasted. This waiver applies to national classes at a USEF licensed-USDF recognized dressage competition.

DR120.2.1 Competitors must wear protective headgear and shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear. T-shirts are not permitted.

DR120.2.2 Competitors are permitted to wear a hat cover and a rain coat, with or without a riding jacket, in inclement weather.

Whips DR121.18: The length of the lash is included in measurements of the length of the whip. For schooling the rider while mounted is permitted to carry one whip that is no longer than 120 cm (47.2 inches) or 100 cm (39.4 inches) for FEI Pony Riders. One whip no longer than 120 cm (47.2 inches) may be carried in all classes except, under penalty of elimination, USEF/USDF Championships, USEF National Dressage Championships, USEF High Performance Championships, and USEF High Performance qualifying and selection trials. Exception: Competitors riding side-saddle may carry a whip no longer than 120 cm (47.2 inches) in USEF/USDF Championships. One whip no longer than 120 cm (47.2 inches) may be carried in all qualifying classes (including NAYRC and NAJC) unless such use is otherwise prohibited by FEI or Federation rules or selection procedures for the classes. However, when a whip is permitted for FEI Pony Tests, the maximum length is 100 cm (39.4 inches). An adjustable-length whip may not be carried by a mounted rider.

The use of one lungeing whip is permitted only when lungeing. There is no restriction on the length of whip permitted for working a horse in hand or on the lunge. Rules regarding whip use at USEF High Performance qualifying and selection trials.

Whips DR121.18 (Continued): The following rules (17.1 and 17.2) apply exclusively to use of a whip at USEF High Performance qualifying and selection trials:

a. Upon arrival on the showground, only the rider while riding, walking, leading or lungeing a horse (lunge whip allowed) is allowed to use a whip (maximum 120 cm) in connection with the training of the horse. The groom may also walk, lead and lunge a horse as above. BOD 1/14/23 Effective 2/1/23

b. The whip must be dropped before entering the space around the competition arena or the rider will be penalized for an error (see DR122.5.j).

Arenas/Footing: All tests will be ridden in Standard 20mx60m arenas. Competition arenas and warm-up arena contain geotextile/sand (GGT) footing. No one on foot is allowed in the warm up arenas. Arenas must be vacated while equipment is being used. Lungeing is allowed only in the designated lunging area and not in the warm-up arenas. The lunging arena footing is geotextile (GGT) footing. Schooling may be permitted in the competition arena, weather permitting, on Friday and at the conclusion of scheduled competition rides in the arenas each day.

No Shows: All "No Shows" who have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.

Bedding: \$16 per bag. Pre-ordered bedding will be delivered to the stall prior to arrival. During the show, additional bedding may be purchased in the show office or by contacting Karla at 619.818.3538 by noon each day. No guarantees of same day delivery if ordered after 12 pm.

Horse Stabling/Tack Stall Fees: Permanent 10'x12' stabling with sliding yoke doors and rubber mat flooring. Water buckets and hoses must be provided by competitor. Stabling is for the show weekend. No initial bedding is provided and must be purchased on entry form. No straw is permitted and only shavings may be used for bedding. Competitors are responsible for stall damage. **YOU MUST LEAVE YOUR STALLS THE WAY YOU FOUND THEM OR GET CHARGED a \$500 FEE**

No refunds for stabling after closing date.

SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN STABLING AREAS

Hauling in Horses: Currently will be allowed for \$75.00/day fee as long as we stay clear of viruses.

Hose/Washing Horses: Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water. Violators will be fined \$50 for each violation.

Stall Cleaning: Deposit all manure at the end of the barn aisles and NOT in the middle or in front of the stalls.

Sharps/Medical Waste Disposal: Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Containers to hold used syringes are located in the barn aisles and in the show office. Please do not use garbage cans for this material.

Safety Regulations: Unauthorized use of the light fixtures will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open-flame devices are not permitted within or near the stables. Electrical outlets are provided.

Property Damage: All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage occurred by them, their horses/animals, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other property on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly.

RV/Camper Reservations: Contact Karla@HITSShows.com. Please reserve RV space on your entry- must be received in advance to guarantee a space.

Leaving the Competition: No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a licensed show after it has commenced, or remove them from the show grounds. Stabled horses must remain on the show grounds until their final ride. If a horse is removed from the show grounds at any time, it will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show.

Riders Under the Age of 14: No rider under the age fourteen is permitted to ride a three-year old colt, or stallion of any age, in any under saddle class including Dressage Sport Horse Prospect Under Saddle, Materiale and Suitability classes. DR202.13

Consecutive Levels: Horses may enter no more than 2 consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Intermediate I and II are not consecutive levels. DR119.2 Please see the USEF Rulebook for more information.

Classes per Day: Horses are limited to a maximum of 3 Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or 2 Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to 2 Dressage rides per day. Horses competing in FEI Para Dressage tests are limited to a maximum of 2 Dressage rides per day including non-Para Dressage FEI, USEF, or USDF tests. FEI Para Dressage tests may be ridden at non-consecutive levels to USDF, USEF, and other FEI tests. Horses may enter no more than 2 consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. FEI Medium Tour Freestyles are permitted only for horses competing at Intermediate A, Intermediate B, or Intermediate II levels. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. DR119.2

FEI Para Dressage Tests: Horses competing in FEI Para Dressage tests are limited to a maximum of two Dressage rides per day including non-Para Dressage FEI, USEF, or USDF tests. See DR119.2. DR303.5

Elimination – More Than 2 Consecutive Levels: Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included (see DR119.2-3). If, due to management or other error, a horse competes in more than two consecutive levels at a competition, the level(s) competed in first that are in compliance with DR119 will be counted for scores and awards. Levels competed in subsequently that are outside the two consecutive level requirement will entail elimination and awards for those classes must be returned. DR124.4

Sound Checks for Musical Freestyle Rides: Riders must upload their music to Equestrian-Hub.com before the start of competition. Each rider will be permitted one representative who may communicate with the person responsible for handling the music to supervise the handling of the music if so desired by the competitor. DR129.6

Sound checks will be conducted Wednesday evening and 30 minutes before the first ride in the morning on competition days by arranging with announcer.

Freestyle Entry: Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation /USDF Licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. To enter an FEI Para Dressage Freestyle class, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in any FEI Para Dressage test (Para Novice Test, Para Intermediate Test or Para Grand Prix Test) at the rider's classified Grade. This score may be earned at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. All FEI Pony Rider Tests are equivalent to Second Level; all FEI Junior Tests are equivalent to Third Level; all FEI Young Rider Tests are equivalent to PSG; and the USEF Brentina Cup (Young Adult) Test and FEI Young Rider Grand Prix 16-25 Tests are equivalent to Intermediate II. For purposes of freestyle qualification, all are considered equivalent to the highest test of that level and may be used to enter a freestyle at that level or a level below. Young Horse and FEI Children Tests cannot be used for freestyle qualification at any level. DR129.9

If Grand Prix Freestyle class is offered at a competition, at least one Grand Prix class must be offered and scheduled prior to the Freestyle (DR126.1.b.6). Additional competition management requirements for freestyle classes are listed in DR126.1.b.6, DR126.1.f.13a, DR126.1.g.4 and DR126.1.j.2-3. DR129.10

Food/Concessions: Food and beverages will be available for purchase in the food court one hour prior to start of show day until end of competition day.

Medical: Medical personnel will be on grounds. Ambulance on call.

DOGS MUST BE ON LEASHES AT ALL TIMES WHILE ON SHOW GROUNDS: (includes stable areas) Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow warning card and may be subject to penalty under Chapter 7. GR1301.6 No other pets or livestock other than horses/mules allowed on grounds.

Motorized Vehicle Statement: In accordance with USEF GR1301.7 and GR1301.8: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. GR1301.7

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. GR1301.8

Emergency Veterinary Treatment of the Horse: In the event of an acute and serious injury to or illness of a horse on competition grounds when the owner or trainer of the horse or agent of the owner is not present, after reasonable effort to contact that individual has been made, competition management, in consultation with a licensed equine veterinarian, may authorize the provision of emergency veterinary treatment of the horse. If competition management so authorizes treatment under the provisions of this rule, competition management and veterinarian are not liable for any resulting costs, damages, losses, claims, or actions arising directly or indirectly from the treatment of the horse. BOD 6/20/22 Effective 12/1/22

Awards: Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, rider will automatically be entered as Open. Introductory through FEI levels – Ribbon 1st through 6th place in each division (Open, Adult Amateur, JR-YR) in each class. Qualifying classes (GAIG/USDF) are run concurrently with rider division class and there will be no separate ribbons awarded. Level Champion High Point Ribbons – High Point ribbons will be awarded for combined classes USDF/USEF level (Introductory through Fourth) and combined FEI classes for each division (Open, Adult Amateur, JR-YR) for the show weekend. Winners are based on a simple high point percentage. Excludes Freestyle, Developing Horse, Young Horse, Dressage Seat Equitation, Materiale, Pas de Deux, Quadrille and Opportunity class scores.

Ties will be broken in accordance with USEF DR123 - In case of equality of points the competitor with the highest marks received under General Impressions shall be declared the winner. When the scores for General Impressions are equal after coefficients have been applied, the horses must remain tied. Young Horse class exception: the marks for "Submission" and "Perspective"/"General Impression" must be combined and divided by two in order to break the tie. If still equal, the "Submission" mark would decide. DR123.3 Freestyle class exception: in the case of a tie, the higher artistic score shall determine the winner. If the artistic mark is the same, the higher mark for harmony will decide. If still tied, the higher mark for choreography will decide. DR129.5

CDS High Score Pony Award: A pony may enter a class to participate in the California Dressage Society High Score Pony award. Excludes Introductory and Freestyle class scores. USEF pony measurement cards are required to qualify. Ribbons will be mailed to the winner.

Fly Hoods Are Permitted For All Classes, Indoor and Outdoor: Fly hoods. Fly hoods (ear covers) that do not cover the horse's eyes can be used to protect horses from insects. Fly hoods may not be attached to the noseband. They should be discreet in color and design, and may have a promotional or manufacturer's logo that is in compliance with DR121.1.b.

- a. Fly hoods are permitted in the warm up and other training areas and for all classes.
- b. Fly hoods may be noise-cancelling in manufactured state but cannot be used with earplugs.
- c. If a tack inspection is performed after completion of the test, the rider or their representative is responsible for removing the fly hood and presenting it for inspection to the designated ring steward who will ensure that nothing prohibited has been added, such as ear plugs.
- d. Blinkers or goggles (with clear or tinted full eye cups) that cover the horse's eyes but do not obstruct the horse's vision are permitted in the warmup but are prohibited in the competition arena. Fly masks are forbidden in warmup, training areas and competition.
- e. Cooling caps (hoods) are prohibited in competition and warmup areas. DR121.8

Ear Plugs: Ear plugs and ear muffs are, under penalty of elimination, prohibited. Exception: Ear plugs are permitted at prize-giving ceremonies for horses competing at any level, including High Performance classes. DR 121.9 Non-U.S. Citizens and Foreign Competitors must provide proof, in English, of current membership in good standing in their respective National Federation, or hold current membership in good standing with the USEF and USDF.

Announcements: Class announcements and ride time announcements are a courtesy to the exhibitor and not all shows provide the capability of public address announcements. Exhibitors are responsible for presenting themselves to the ring at their designated time and accept the full responsibility for doing so. Competitions offering public announcements will make every effort to maintain a working PA system, but it is stressed that it is still the exhibitors' responsibility to be on time. No protest will be upheld, nor any ride time changed, on the basis of a PA breakdown or missed announcement. Ring stewards will also make every effort to keep people informed for entering the ring in a timely fashion. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the correct show time and their scheduled performance time regardless of PA announcements or ring stewards. No protest will be upheld, nor ride time changed due to failure of the exhibitor to meeting their responsibilities.

Open Classes: A class that is open to all. There are no restrictions based on the horse (age, sex, size, residence or membership of owner) or rider (age, experience, qualifications, sex, residence, etc.)

Adult Amateur Classes: Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. Only active United States Equestrian Federation members may obtain amateur status. (Exception: Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show by show basis at no cost). Participants must possess current USEF Amateur status and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules. If opportunity classes at Dressage Competitions are restricted to amateurs, riders are required to have an amateur status with USEF. Beginning January 1, 2023, anyone born in 2001 will turn 22 and is considered an adult for the purpose of competing in a dressage competition.

CDS SAN DIEGO ROAD TO CHAMPIONSHIPS SHOW

JR/YR Classes: Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. DR119.3

JR/YR Classes (Continued): For purposes of qualification for and participation in competitions conducted under FEI rules, age groups are as follows:

- a. **Young Riders:** Same as in DR119.3;
- b. **Juniors:** Individuals are eligible as Juniors from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18;
- c. **Pony Riders:** Individuals are eligible as Pony Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16;
- d. **Children:** Individuals are eligible to participate in competitions and championships for Children from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14;
- e. A person may compete as a U25 Rider from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of sixteen (16) until the end of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of twenty five (25). DR119.4 Must include birth date on entry form.

Adult Amateur Vintage/Master Classes: A restricted class that is not open to all. Adult Amateur Vintage/Master Classes are open to any Adult Amateur rider 50 years of age or older. These classes are eligible as a GAIG/USDF Regional Championship qualifier.

Pony Classes: Open to all breeds that meet the following measurement requirements. A pony is an animal that does not exceed 148 cm without shoes and 149 cm with shoes. GR144.1.b. The pony can be of any sex (mare, stallion, or gelding).

USDF Non-member Fee: For each USDF non-member owner/lessee and USDF non-member rider, there will be a USDF non-member fee of \$35 per competition. Entries in Introductory and Opportunity classes are exempt from this requirement.

USEF/USDF Horse Requirements: All horses entered in USEF/USDF recognized shows must at least have a USDF HID (Horse Identification) number in order to participate. If riding in qualifying classes, the horse must have a USDF Lifetime Registration in addition to a USEF Annual or Lifetime Recording. Exempt from this requirement are horses showing in Introductory Level, Opportunity Classes, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, and exhibitions. These horse identification numbers may be obtained from USEF and USDF.

Hazardous Weather/Acts of God/Accident/Emergency/Pandemic Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to Hazardous Weather, Acts of God, Accidents, Emergencies or Pandemics. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to Hazardous Weather, Acts of God, Accidents, Emergencies or Pandemics.

Opportunity Classes: Any Opportunity Classes offered will include "Opportunity" in the class name. These classes will follow all USEF Dressage Division rules and applicable USEF General Rules, including dress and saddlery.

- Opportunity Classes are for entry level participants and these classes are judged by USEF licensed judges or FEI dressage judges.
- Horses and/or riders may enter in Opportunity Classes and cross enter into the rated/recognized classes at this competition. All applicable fees and membership requirements will apply.
- Opportunity Classes cannot be used as qualifying classes for the Great American/USDF Regional Championships.
- Freestyles or Test of Choice classes are not offered as Opportunity classes.
- Riders, Owners, Trainers and Coaches entered only in these classes are exempt from both USEF and USDF membership requirements and are not required to pay Show Pass/non-member fees but are required to list the USEF/USDF membership numbers if the participants have them.
- **Horses entered only in these classes:**
 - **Are** exempt from the USEF fee, including the Equine Drugs and Medication fee. Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing.
 - **Are not** required to have either a USEF or USDF Horse Identification (HID) or Recording Number but are to list the HID or Recording numbers if the horse has been assigned these numbers.

MEMBERSHIP/REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR GAIG/USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES

Riders must be current USDF Participating members & USEF members (Junior, Senior or Life) in good standing. Horses must be USDF registered and USEF recorded. Horses with only an HID are not eligible. Owners must be current USDF Participating or Business members & USEF members (Junior, Senior or Life) in good standing. - Participants at the RAAC shows must be current members of CDS, must have a USEF Amateur Card under Dressage Rules, and must be 22 years old or older.
- CDS membership for both the rider and the horse owner must be current when all scores are earned in order to count as qualifying.
- Qualification is for an amateur rider/horse team.
- To be eligible to compete, the \$25 registration fee for each horse and rider team per level MUST BE PAID to the CDS Central Office by close of business no later than 12 days prior to the first day of competition at the regional show entered.
- Current Year Qualifying Opens: AUGUST 29, 2023
- Current Year Qualifying Closes: JULY 8, 2024
- Scores earned at the CDS Championship Show will NOT count towards qualification for RAAC purposes. RAAC scores do count for the CDS Championship Show provided all the other requirements are met.
- Qualified horse/rider teams can compete AT ONE of the three regional RAAC shows held during the year. Eligible horse/rider teams are permitted to compete at ANY RAAC event. For example, a competitor can qualify in the southern region and opt to enter the central RAAC.
- Qualification scores must be earned at CDS recognized shows and are as follows:
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at Intro Level test C of 65% or higher at Novice Level only
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any Training Level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any 1st level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any 2nd level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any 3rd Level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at any 4th level test of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at Prix St. Georges of 60% or higher
 - 3 scores from 2 judges at Intermediate 1 of 60% or higher
- Elite horse and rider teams that have won either Champion or Reserve Champion at the CDS Annual Championship Show at Training and 1st Levels are not eligible to compete in the RAAC shows at the level they have won.
- Winners of the RAAC classes; Training through Intermediaire 1 Elite or Novice, will automatically be considered qualified for the CDS Championship Show at the same level.

AWARDS

Award and neck sash to Winner and Reserve, bridle ribbons 3rd through 10th place in all Divisions and Classes.

Overall High Score award for Novice and Elite.

Roses Award neck ribbons will be awarded in three divisions, Novice and Elite riders 50 years of age and older who officially sign-up for the division prior to their RAAC ride.

Divisions: Basic through First, Second through Fourth and FEI for Novice and Training through First, Second through Fourth and FEI for Elite.

Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person, horse owned or exhibited by said exhibitor and shall indemnify the show, the management, the show committee and volunteers, the USEF Licensee, the USEF and USDF, or any member thereof, against all claims and demands, of any nature or kind, that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any horses owned or exhibited by them, or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse. All horses exhibited in this show participate entirely at the owner's risk. Neither the Organizing Committee, show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, any host GMO, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.
- Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit their entry fee and other fees.

MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or*
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

2024 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2024 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).

A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.
