ELIGIBILITY: Trainers and riders must be members of CPHA prior to riding in any CPHA class. Previous winners of the CPHA Jr. and Amateur Medal Finals are not eligible to compete again in the same final. Winners of the Junior Medal Final may compete in the Amateur Final when they become age-eligible.

QUALIFYING: Must earn 6 points to qualify (points awarded 10,6,4,3,2).

FORMAT: Fences to be set at 3'6". Final consists of one warm-up class, two rounds for all competitors, and a third round of the top ten finalists in each section (junior and amateur). There may be a work-off if needed (see below).

WARM-UP CLASS: A non-judged warm-up class will be held at 3'6" for qualified riders entered in the finals. Each rider may ride up to two horses in the warm-up class.

SCHOOLING RULES: One hour prior to the start of the class, riders may only school in the designated schooling area for this final. Jumps must be flagged and the flags may be changed. The schooling ring will follow USEF Jumper Schooling Rules but will also allow Swedish Oxers (max 12-inch difference), tarps, coolers, liverpools, flower boxes, and similar items. All schooling items must be present in the schooling area for anyone to use at the start of the class and remain until the end of the class.

ORDER OF GO: First round order of go will be drawn during the warm-up class. The second round will be a jumper rotation of the first-round order of go. The third round will consist of the top ten riders with the best scores from the first two rounds. The order of go for round 3 will be determined by those scores with the lowest going first. If the total scores over the first two rounds produce ties going in to round 3, the rider with the higher score in round 2 goes later in the order. If there is a tie for 10th place going in to round 3, both riders will compete in round 3 (a total of 11 riders).

SCORING: Three judges will score the final. At no time will they sit together. At the completion of each round, only the sum total of the three judges' scores will be announced. All carryover scores from round 1 will be announced when the rider completes round 2. Only at the completion of a rider's third round, will each judge's score be announced separately. The winner will be the rider with the highest sum of all judges' scores over the three rounds, unless a workoff is required (see below).

WORK-OFF: At the completion of round 3, if any rider's score is within three points of the top rider's score (three or fewer points) those riders will be considered tied equally and will be required to complete an additional work-off decided by the judges using USEF Tests 1-21. The rider with the highest score in the work-off round will be determined the winner.

COURSE: Fences to be set at 3'6". Final consists of three equitation courses of increasing difficulty. First round primarily consists of hunter-type fences with special jumps used in a medal final or hunter derby. The second round adds more jumper-style fences. The third round adds course difficulty over all types of fences. Juniors and amateurs WILL NOT NECESSARILY jump the same course in each round. There will be a separate set of course walks for each final – junior and amateur. The judges must arrive at least 90 minutes prior to the start of the class to walk the course before the exhibitors.

AWARDS: Ribbons and awards will be given in the first and second rounds to tenth place. Overall awards will be presented after the third round, unless a work-off is required (see above). Ties in round 1 and 2 will be broken by the call judge, who will be determined prior to the start of the class. In the event of an overall tie after the third round, the rider with the highest score in round 3 will receive the higher overall placing. The top rider aged 36 or older will be recognized with a special award.

EQUIPMENT: Tack allowed per USEF EQ106.5a.1.2.3.

HORSE RESTRICTIONS: The same horse may not be ridden in both age groups. A rider must show the same horse through all phases of the competition. In the event of illness or injury of the horse, the rider may petition the Technical Delegate to ride a substitute horse. The substitution must be approved by an appeals committee consisting of the Technical Delegate, Show Steward, and the official show veterinarian (who has examined the horse and determined its unsuitability to continue).

PROTESTS: If a competitor or trainer wishes to discuss any part of the CPHA Jr. or Amateur Final with a judge or the course designer, the Technical Delegate or a Show Steward must also be present. A protest must be made in writing within 30 minutes of the completion of the class to the Technical Delegate or a Show Steward. A committee consisting of the Technical Delegate, the Show Steward, and a representative of show management will be convened as soon as feasible to rule on the protest. This committee will be the sole arbiter of the protest and its decision will be final without further recourse of any kind.

All qualifying classes will be stand-alone and will consist of a 3'6" hunter course and be judged by a single judge on a score of 1-100. Riders may enter more than one horse in the qualifying events. There must be at least six entries in a qualifying event for it to count for qualifying for the Final. A rider can only qualify once. If a rider who is already qualified rides in a subsequent qualifying class and places 1-3, the next placed unqualified rider in the class (4th place, etc) will qualify for the Final. If a rider places in the top three with more than one horse at a single qualifying event (i.e., places 1st and 3rd), that rider will qualify for the Final and the next placed unqualified rider (4th or 5th, etc) in that class will also qualify for the Final.

24 riders will qualify by placing first, second or third at one of the eight qualifying classes listed below. The 2025 winner of the ClipMyHorse.TV Hunter Classic automatically qualifies, and will be the 25th qualified rider.

Qualifying classes are open to all junior and amateur riders who pay the \$250 one-time annual nomination fee and enter the class. The entry fee for each qualifying class will be \$50. All qualifying classes will be an overlay with the 3' Adult or 3' Child Classic held at the designated qualifying show and will consist of the score from the first round only of the Classic. There must be at least six entries in each overlay class for it to count for qualifying for the Final. Riders may enter more than one horse in a qualifying class, but will receive qualifying points only for their highest placed horse in the class. Each rider can use their points from up to four of the eight qualifying classes. Restrictions on a rider jumping higher heights at the show will follow that show's Zone rules for the 3' Adult and 3' Child Classics.

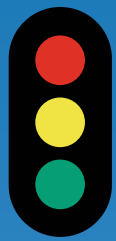
The top 20 Junior Riders and top 20 Amateur Riders based on the rider's cumulative points from their best four qualifying classes will qualify to ride in the Finals. Riders with tied points will all qualify. If a qualified rider does not enter the Final, Management has the option to replace the rider with the next highest placing rider to keep the Final at 20 riders. In year two (2027) and future years, the prior year's winner of the Junior Rider and winner of the Amateur Rider Finals will automatically qualify, making 21 riders in each of the Finals (more if tied).

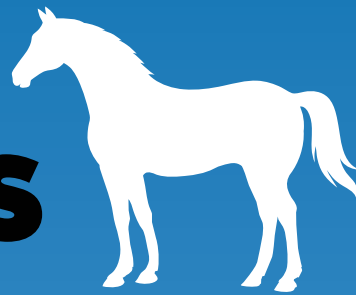

USEF has developed horse welfare guidelines based on the stoplight system to help us recognize acceptable or unacceptable interactions between horses and humans

GREEN

horse friendly

The horse appears happy, willing, and content.

The connection between horse and human is harmonious and in sync.

YELLOW

cautionary

Actions that cause you to pause and question whether they are acceptable.

Some actions may be acceptable for a very short period of time but may escalate to mistreatment if pressure or conflict increases in intensity.

RED

unacceptable OR not okay

Actions that make you think, "This is not okay."

Actions that make you immediately think,
"This behavior must stop."

Sometimes athletes can be acting in the red zone without even realizing it - these situations may be resolved by a licensed official interrupting the training, discussing the issue, and providing a verbal warning.

If you see an interaction that falls into the red zone, please alert an official to the situation and submit a report.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands.
This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

HERE ARE A FEW REMINDERS ABOUT THE BEST WAYS YOU CAN KEEP YOUR HORSES SAFE & HEALTHY

- **Temperature Monitoring:** Twice daily temperature monitoring is highly encouraged while on the competition grounds and management will provide temp logs upon request. In the event of elevated disease risk or an infectious disease incursion, management will notify competitors of mandatory twice daily temperature monitoring and recording (ideally 12 hours apart and prior to any temperature-reducing medication (i.e. Bute or Banamine). Temperature logs will be provided for placement on the stall door for recording temperatures.
- **Limit Horse-to-Horse Contact:** Direct contact between horses from different home facilities should be minimized, and horse-to-human contact between facilities should be limited.
- **Avoid Shared Equipment or Water Sources.** Do not share equipment between horses, and do not use communal water sources. Make sure horses have their own buckets, feed pans, grooming equipment, and rags, and limit or eliminate other equipment that touches more than one horse. Fill water buckets without submerging the hose in the buckets.
- **Reporting a Febrile Horse:** Any horse with a temperature over 101.5F is required to be reported immediately to the official veterinarian, who will examine the horse to determine the next steps, and to horse show management. Any horse suspected of having an infectious disease will be required to immediately enter isolation stabling or be removed from the property.
- **Reporting a Sick Horse:** Report any horse with observable signs of illness, including, but not limited to, nasal discharge, abnormal gait, change in feed or water consumption, or change in behavior to the official veterinarian and show management.

IF AN INFECTIOUS DISEASE IS SUSPECTED

- **The official veterinarian** may require a potentially sick horse to be tested for infectious disease at the owner's expense. If the owner/trainer chooses not to submit to testing, the horse may be asked to leave the competition venue.
- **Per USEF requirements,** we have a biosecurity plan in place for where and how to isolate any potentially sick or exposed horses, and we will work closely with state animal health officials to assist with contact tracing and any additional health and safety measures they require.
- **Failure to Comply with Biosecurity Measures:** Individuals who fail to comply with any biosecurity requirements will be reported to USEF for enforcement action and may be removed from the premises.

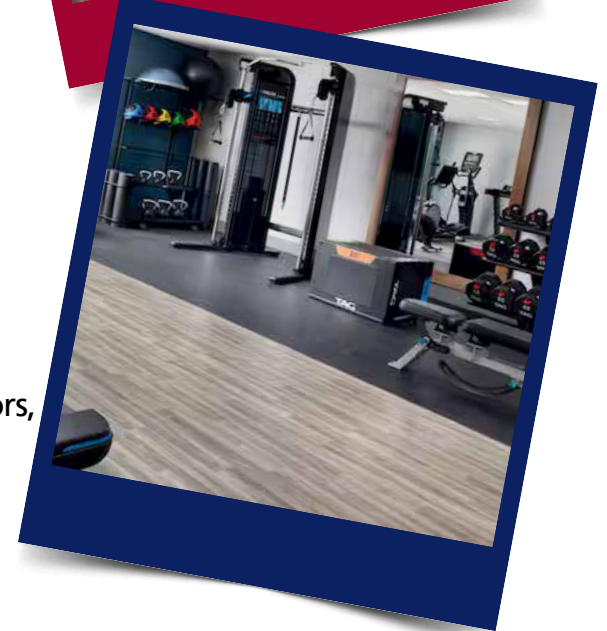
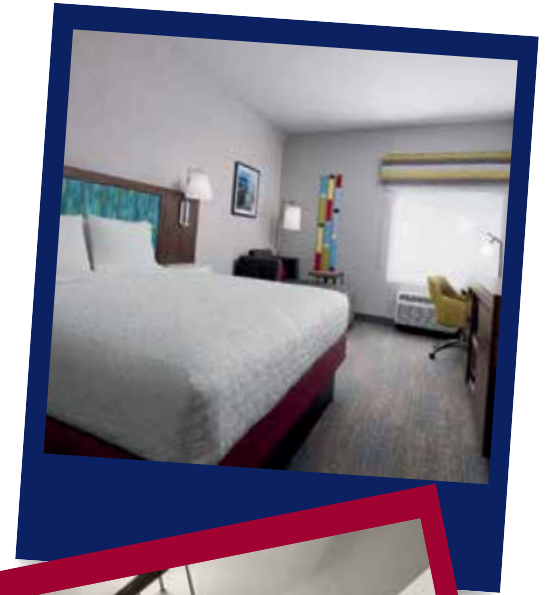

Show Weeks May Close: Exhibitors are advised that some show weeks may sell out. After the Closing Date of Entries, priority is given to exhibitors who enter two or more show weeks.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded to eighth place in all Hunter and Jumper Classes unless otherwise noted. Prize Money is awarded to Sixth place in Hunter classes and to Sixth or Eighth place in Jumper classes. For Special Classes and Classics, see Prize Money Distribution on the previous page.

International Riders: All classes held during the 2026 Del Mar Series will be run under National rules with regard to riders. If the capacity of International riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a First come, First served basis. All International Riders must have an active, competing USEF and USHJA Membership as well as having completed SafeSport Training for Riders 18 and Older.

HJ106.2: All horses regardless of show or non-showing are required to submit an entry with the Horse Show Office and wear or display the back number at all times. Any horse without a back number or with an incorrect back number will be asked to leave the area.

Longeing: Horses must be longed in the official longeing area only. All horses must wear, or be accompanied with a visible entry number. No chasing, whip cracking, or plastic bags on whips. Stirrups may not hang from the saddle while longeing. Dangerous horses will not be permitted, and will be asked to leave. No phones or radios.

HUNTERS

Nomination Fee: \$75

Jog: Jogging will be conducted under HU118.3, Option A: Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. The following sections will not jog: Children's, Adult, Low Children's, Low Adult, Schooling, Baby Green, Young, Thoroughbred Hunter, Modified Junior/Amateur, Pre-Children's/Adult, Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup, Schooling Pony, Green Schooling Pony & all other miscellaneous classes..

Warm-Up: Ticketed warm-up schedule will be posted in the Show Office. Tickets are \$50 each and will be billed to the back number worn at the ring.

Schooling is prohibited in the show rings.

24-Hour Stabling Rule: International Hunter Derbies and any class of \$25,000 or more will be subject to the USEF 24-Hour Stabling Rule. Horses must purchase a stall directly from the show and reside in the stall on the official Showgrounds of HITS Del Mar Show Park for the 24-Hour period leading up to and during the class.

2026 Zone 10 Specifications: (Check USHJA.org for the most updated specs.)

- **Adult Amateur Hunter:** Riders may not cross enter into any Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance Hunter class at the same competition. Exception - under saddle classes. Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition with fences exceeding 3'3" except Jumper Classes not exceeding 1.25m, Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby. Riders may cross enter between the Adult Amateur Hunter and the Amateur Owner section if the rider owns the horse he or she is showing in the Adult Amateur section. Horses may not cross enter into any Amateur Owner hunter class (at the same show).
- **Adult Amateur Hunter Low:** Open to Adult Amateurs showing horses and/or ponies. Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 3'0".
- **Children's Hunter:** Riders may not cross enter into any Junior Hunter, Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance Hunter class at the same show. Exception - under saddle classes. Children's riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition with fences exceeding 3'3" (exception: Jumper Classes not exceeding 1.25m, Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby). A Children's Hunter rider may ride a Junior Hunter in the Junior Hunter Under Saddle class for a Junior Hunter rider that has more than one horse entered. No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. Horses may not cross enter into any 3'6" Junior Hunter Class at the same competition.
- **Children's Hunter Low:** Open to junior riders showing horses. Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 3'0".
- **Children's Hunter Pony:** Open to junior riders showing ponies. Rider age restrictions as found in "Regular Pony" sections do not apply. If showing in the Regular or Green Pony Hunter section, riders may ride only one pony at 2' or one pony at 2'6" at the same show. Riders may not cross enter into any class where fences exceed 3'3". Exception: Pony Jumpers. The Pony, with another rider, may cross enter into any class where otherwise eligible. Fences 2' small and medium, 2'6" large. No Combinations.
- **General (Hunters):** Horses/ponies are not required to be jogged for soundness. To be judged on performance, soundness and suitability to count.

Nomination 2 - \$125 (below 1.20m) **Jumper Sections:** .70m - 1.15m, Junior, Amateur, Thoroughbred, Cross Rail Olympic, 1.0m & 1.10m Young Jumper and Pony Jumpers.

Nomination 3 - \$225 (1.20m and above) **Jumper Sections:** 1.20m - 1.40m, 1.20m Young Jumper, 1.20m-1.40m Junior and Amateur Jumpers.

Eligibility: Any horse, regardless of winnings, is eligible to enter any .70m - 1.50m or Open Jumper Class.

Declarations: Nominated Jumpers must declare on the appropriate form in the Show Office the day before the class is to be held. Late declarations will be subject to the Post Entry Penalty and may require the horse to work first or last in the order at management discretion. Classes entered on the Entry Blank constitute a Declaration.

Jumper Tables: Refer to the Time Schedule. Management reserves the right to change tables based on weather, entries or other criteria.

Time Allowed: The Time Allowed will be based on a speed of 360 yards per minute for Pony Jumpers, and 382 yards per minute for all other sections unless otherwise noted, and may be adjusted accordingly.

Draw Reins / German Martingales: No Draw reins and German martingale may not be used in any competition/class restricted to Ponies, Juniors, and/or Amateurs, or by age of horse.

Draw reins and German martingales may only be used in a conventional manner when schooling or in classes with no prize money that are offered at 1.20m or below. Draw reins and/or German martingales may not be used on Ponies at any time when ridden by a Junior. No other head set devices (chambon, etc.) are permitted in any class.

Tack & Attire: Please refer to JP 111 for complete tack & attire regulations.

Ties: Ties involving first place will be jumped off. Ties not involving first place will be decided upon time unless otherwise stated.

24-Hour Stabling Rule: Any class of \$25,000 or more will be subject to the USEF 24-Hour Stabling Rule. Horses must purchase a stall directly from the show and reside in the stall on the official Showgrounds of HITS Del Mar Show Park for the 24-Hour period leading up to and during the class. Horses must be entered in the class and have purchased a stall.

2026 Zone 10 Specifications: (Check USHJA.org for the most updated specs.)

- **Jr/Am 1.10m/1.15m Jumper:** Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25m is ineligible to compete in an Am Jumper class set below 1.20m at that competition.
- **Jr/Am 1.0m/1.05m Jumper:** Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25m is ineligible to compete in an Am Jumper class set below 1.20m at that competition.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Order of Go: The Order of Go will be drawn. In the jump-off, if any, all horses will go in the original drawn order.

Attire: Formal attire required in Special Classes, please see JP 111.

Awards: Winners to ride for presentation of awards in Special Classes

Trophy & Ribbons: 1-12 in Special Classes unless otherwise stated

Show Champion: Classics do not count towards division Championship awards.

GENERAL INFORMATION, RULES & REGULATIONS

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Every class offered herein that is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) headline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT

These competitions are governed and approved by the United States Equestrian Federation. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. To the extent there is a conflict between the prize list and the USEF rules, USEF rules will prevail.

USEF WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK & INDEMNITY AGREEMENT: Effective immediately, all individuals on the property will be required to sign the USEF Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement. The Agreement will be available on our website (HITSShows.com) and can be executed and signed electronically.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the Competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation, the construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR907.4. If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber and competing only in classes that are exempt from membership requirements, I acknowledge and agree that I will be enrolled at no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew unless and until USEF determines in its sole discretion to terminate my Fan account. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733.

MANAGEMENT: Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by Horse Show Management-their decision to be final. Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate or change judges and officials; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel. Management reserves the right to limit entries in a class. Refused entries will be returned.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK: By signing the entry blank, the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Loungeur acknowledges that horseback riding, particularly jumping, is a dangerous activity and involves inherent risks that may cause serious injury and in some cases death because of the unpredictable nature and irrational behavior of horses, regardless of their training and past performance and expressly assumes all such inherent risks whether identified herein, in the entry blank, or in the Federation Rules and Regulations. A horse, without warning or any apparent cause, can buck, stumble, fall, rear, bite, kick, run, make unpredictable movements, spook, jump obstacles, step on a person's foot or push a person-all of which may cause the rider or observer to fall or be jolted, resulting in serious injury or death. A horse may also become loose and cause injury to an observer or rider or to another horse-a loose horse can run at full gallop in a panic and run into objects or persons or other horses. The Show Ground Facilities are bordered by highways/roads and thus noise from traffic and other sources occurs that can and will cause a horse to unexpectedly spook or react quickly. The Show Ground Facilities contain roads or driveways that are traversed by cars, golf carts, tractors, trailers and heavy equipment all of which may spook a horse. The above warnings and risks are meant as an example of some of the risks that are inherent and may be encountered but it is agreed this is not an exhaustive list and there are numerous additional conditions and/or events that may result in injuries while participating in the Competition and/or being present on the Show Ground Facility.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Horse Show and its officials, employees, directors, officers, HITS LLC and its Sponsors, etc for any loss or accident to his horse, horses, employees or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

DAMAGE: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

ADHERENCE TO THE RULES: All individuals on the horse park property are required to adhere to the rules mentioned in the prize list or as directed by the employees at the horse park. Trainers are all responsible for employees adhering to the rules. Violations will result in expulsion from the horse park.

GOVERNING LAW & VENUE: Any and all disputes related to or arising from HITS' management and/or operation of its horse shows shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York without giving reference to New York's conflict of laws principles. Any disputes that cannot be resolved by the parties shall first be subject to a mediation with a New York chosen mediator. If mediation fails, the parties agree to present to arbitration at HITS' discretion under the American Arbitration Association, and if not Arbitrated, subject to litigation solely in the Courts of Ulster County New York. The parties agree the time limit to object to horse show charges shall be thirty days from the close of the horse show for the week at issue. Any other claims must be brought within one year.

HITS SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY: HITS encourages positivity in the use of social media platforms and urges persons posting information about HITS, its management, shows, exhibitors, officials, equine athletes, and others to exercise good judgement and think about the potential consequences of their posts and interactions on social media platforms. We urge those using social media to refrain from making derogatory, offensive, inflammatory, or false comments about other athletes, trainers, HITS and its management, our equine athletes, USEF, or any individuals associated with our HITS horse shows. HITS reserves the right to remove third-party content from its social media platforms that violates its social media policy and in extenuating circumstances may block a user from HITS social media sites for repeated offenses of its policy.

AUTHORIZATION TO SHARE EMAIL AND CONTACT INFORMATION WITH HITS PARTNERS AND HITS RELATED ENTITIES By signing the online entry, I expressly authorize HITS, LLC to collect and share my email address and other contact information provided on the entry blank with HITS Partners and HITS related entities for purposes of sending me periodic updates, product information, and promotional offers via email. I understand that my email address will be kept confidential and will not be shared or sold to any other third parties without my explicit consent. I acknowledge that I may unsubscribe from these communications at any time by clicking the 'unsubscribe' link in the footer of any email I receive.

ENTRY POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Entries must be submitted electronically through the Show Management System Online Entry platform, and must be filled out in its entirety.
FAXED, MAILED OR EMAILED ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- A \$500 deposit is due per horse at the time of entry and is non-refundable after the entry due date. This deposit will be applied to the individual horse account for that show. This deposit does not reserve the stall and is non-transferable between horses or accounts.
- A Signed Open Check or Credit Card Authorization must be lodged with the Show Secretary each week before Numbers are issued.
- Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express are accepted. Customers paying by credit card should reference the Retail pricing.
- A 3% credit card fee will be applied to all credit card transactions and is nonrefundable once the card has been processed.
- Entries received after the Closing Date will be Late and subject to the Post Entry Penalty of \$75.
- Entries received after 5 pm Monday of the show will be subject to the Show Week Post Entry Penalty of \$150.
- Every account must have a valid credit card on file at HITS that will be applied to the entry charges before the back number will be issued. If there is not a credit card on file, to pick up a number a valid signed check made to HITS must be in the show office and will be used to close the account at the end of the show week.
- Accounts must be closed at the end of each show week. Exhibitors are encouraged to close out their account in person. Exhibitors who do not close out in person automatically authorize HITS to close their account using the Check / Credit Card on file. Billing questions or refunds will not be considered after the show in question.
- Any exhibitor with an unpaid balance after Sunday will be billed for these charges and a \$50 check out fee will be added to the total due.
- Entries will not be permitted to show until previous week balances are closed.
- Substitution of horses are allowed with the same owner.
- An **All Inclusive Facility Fee of \$175** will be assessed to all showing horses. This fee entitles the horses to unlimited adds / scratches according to the add/scratch policy (does not apply to Special classes) as well as access to riding and lunging areas. Manure, Medic and Environmental fees are included in the Facility Fee.
- **NON-SHOWING HORSES** must be properly entered, purchase a stall, wear a back number, and meet the health and vaccination requirements. \$500 per week.

ADDS/SCRATCHES: All adds must be made by 4 pm the day prior to each class. No entries will be accepted for a class scheduled on the same day. In the unusual case the time schedule allows a management approved add the day of a class, the entry fee will be double. Horses and riders who go in a class without entering will pay a fee of \$50. All scratches must be received in the show office before the start of the class in writing to be considered for a refund; scratches via phone call or at the gate will NOT be considered. In divisions that are entered by complete section, no refund will be considered if the horse shows in any class of the division. The only other refunds given will be for cancellation of a class by Management, overpayment of fees, or the rejection of entries because of ineligibility or lack of stall space.

TRAINER'S BARN ACCOUNT

- Trainers must create a "Barn Account" entry to order items (tack stalls, paddocks, RVs, feed & bedding) that they intend to split.
- Trainer's Splits: This service allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until close of business Friday. Only items billed by the Horse Show such as feed, bedding, tack stalls, etc., will be split. Only dollar amounts will be split and totals will be rounded up. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected
- Trainers confirm express authority to charge client's account for trainer split charges (including feed, bedding, groom and tack stall, etc.), and authority to use client's credit card to pay those charges. Trainer agrees to indemnify and hold harmless HITS, LLC and its agents for all such charges and from any dispute arising related to the charges that is brought by client or other person or entity.

REFUNDS

- Refund of pre-paid fees will be given for show scratches received prior to or on the Closing Date. Scratch must be made in writing, according to the procedure outlined above.
- Refund for Horse Deposits, Stalls, Paddocks and RV Sites will not be given for entries scratched after the Closing Date. Exhibitors are responsible for any such outstanding fees.
- If eligible for refund, a check for refund due less an office fee of \$25 will be mailed within 30 days after the completion of the final Show of the Circuit.
- Billing questions or requests for refunds will not be considered after the Show in question.

RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS: Checks returned by the bank or Credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$50 penalty or will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited. A monthly service fee equal to 18% per annum will begin accruing after 30 days. Note: First time returned checks will automatically be redeposited.

PRIZE MONEY

- **Prize Money will be applied to entries.** The Payee will default to the Owner, if the Prize Money Recipient is not provided on the submitted entry each week. A W-9 or W-8BEN, valid Social Security or Federal ID number, and complete mailing address must be provided. If the SSN/EIN has not been provided to the show office within 90 days of the competition, it will be forfeited. Net Prize Money credits will be issued as a check and will be mailed or hand-delivered within 30 days after the Show, thereby ending the show's responsibility. **Exhibitors:** Please verify the correct payee and mailing address is recorded in the Show Office. **HITS is not responsible for checks lost or issued to incorrect payees.**
- If the SSN/EIN is not provided, Prize Money will be withheld until SSN / EIN is provided.
- If the IRS has notified us of a discrepancy in Payee name or SSN / EIN prize money will be withheld until the discrepancy is resolved.
- If an outstanding balance exists on an account, prize money may be withheld.
- If the SSN/EIN has not been provided to the show office within 90 days of the competition, it will be forfeited. Prize Money will not be reissued after 90 days.
- **Prize Money Won by Foreign Exhibitors** is subject to the U.S. Internal Revenue Service regulation requiring sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form W-8BEN prior to receiving prize money.
- **Prize Money** is awarded through 6th place in hunter classes and through 6th or 8th place in jumper classes. A class that pays based on a number of entries will pay based on the number of on-time entries and post entries will not be included in the number used to determine the payout. Special Class Prize Money distribution is published in this book.
- A class with fewer than three entries will not award prize money.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE:

- Stalls will be available by 2 pm, Monday of each competition week. All stalls must be vacated by 7 pm, Sunday, unless showing for consecutive weeks.
- Early Arrival will be charged \$100 per stall, Late Departure \$250 per stall and must be pre-arranged with management.

STABLING: Permanent stalls and tack rooms will be available for \$600, 10' x 12' with top and bottom doors and dirt flooring. Temporary stalls and tack rooms will be available for \$550, 10' x 12' with top and bottom doors and matted floors. Only shavings will be permitted for bedding of stalls. Exhibitors may be assessed a disposal fee for anything other than shavings. However, we cannot guarantee stabling for post entries, and we recommend that your entries be received before the closing date. The show office handles all stall transactions and charges. Private transactions involving stalls are not permitted. Management reserves the right to limit tack stalls. Hauling in is not permitted. All horses entered must purchase a show stall.

STALL CLEANING: Please deposit all manure at the ends of the barn aisles and NOT in the middle or in front of the stalls. If you leave anything behind in the stable area, you will be billed a minimum of \$500. If syringes are left anywhere other than the receptacles provided you will be billed \$75 per syringe. This will be strictly enforced. Trainers are encouraged to supervise their staff to avoid this fee.

STALL ALTERATIONS: As part of HITS Del Mar's ongoing commitment to ensure the safety of all participants, particularly the horses in this instance, as well as preserving the integrity of our facilities, we are implementing important updates to our stabling guidelines. These new guidelines apply to all events hosted at Del Mar Horse Park. We kindly ask for your attention to the following points: **Removal of Stall Customizations:** Effective immediately, all customizations to the stalls, including but not limited to nails, screws, staples, eye hooks, plastic sheeting, metal wire, twine, and the like must be removed. The use of such materials, especially staples, poses significant risks to the horses and the integrity of our facilities. We strongly recommend the elimination, or at the very least, significant limitation of staples inside the stalls. Our goal is to ensure that all stalls are safe, clean, and in their original condition (minus the bedding). It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure that their staff is fully informed of and complies with these updated guidelines. We encourage team leads to hold briefings with their staff to ensure everyone is aware of these changes and understands the importance of adhering to them. Fines for Non-Compliance: In our efforts to maintain the highest standards of facility upkeep and animal safety, **HITS Del Mar will impose a fine of \$500 for stalls that are not left in good condition.** This measure is not intended to be punitive, but rather to underscore the importance of leaving the stalls in the same condition as they were found (bedding excluded). We believe this will encourage a collective effort towards maintaining a clean and safe environment for everyone, a form of pay-it-forward to all who utilize our stabling. We understand that these updates may require some adjustments, and we appreciate your cooperation and commitment to creating a safe experience for all. Should you have any questions or need further clarification, please do not hesitate to contact our office. DelMarOffice@HITSShows.com

LAYOVER: Stalls will be available for laying over between shows. Please contact Del Mar Horsepark for availability, pricing and reservations.

FEED & BEDDING: Pre-orders and onsite orders must be submitted through HITSShows.com/Horse-Show-Office (online order) Orders must be made by NOON each day for same-day delivery through the website.

RV RESERVATIONS: Contact DelMarRV@HITSShows.com. RV space reservations must be received in advance to guarantee a space.

WASHING HORSES: Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water.

MEDICAL WASTE: All needles and syringes MUST be deposited in designated disposal containers and not left in stalls or thrown in trash receptacles. Violators will be fined \$75 per needle/syringe. For the first offense the trainer/owner will be notified as well as the appropriate association. The second offense will disqualify the individual and horse and they will be banished from the show with NO REFUND.

SAFETY REGULATIONS: Unauthorized use of the light fixtures will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open flame devices are not permitted within the stables. Keep flammable decorations to a minimum. Electrical outlets are provided.

SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Gate Stewards are schooling supervisors and have absolute authority to scratch riders who do not follow USEF, FEI or appropriate association schooling rules.

ATTIRE: Proper attire is required in all hunter, equitation rings during competition as well as Jumper classes with \$1,000 or more in prize money. Proper Attire is requested for all other jumper classes.

DOGS: Dogs and other pets must be confined to the Stable Area. Dogs must be on a leash at all times. Stray dogs and dogs in violation will be impounded by Animal Control authorities. Under no circumstances are dogs allowed at the arenas. **Loose Dog Fine:** \$100

Management will not be responsible for mail or parcel deliveries made to exhibitors, vendors or others. Please make arrangements accordingly.

PROTEST: Any USEF member lodging a protest must first deposit \$200 (non-members \$300) payable to HITS with the Show Secretary, which sum shall be forfeited to the Horse Show, if same is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed by the protester and filed within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation. A protest may be filed with the Show Manager, the Federation Hearing committee or Show Secretary. If the protest is sustained, the entries standing next in award shall be moved up accordingly. See USEF GR603 and GR603.1.

VACCINATION INFORMATION: Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. The Equine Health Requirements are Required for all horses entering the Show Grounds both Showing and Non Showing. To ensure the safety of all horses competing at HITS managed venues, the following documentation must be uploaded through EquiTrace EventPass prior to on-site arrival. Each horse entering the show grounds is required to have a negative coggins (within a year) and proof of Flu/ Rhino and EHV 1/4 vaccinations (within 6 months). Additional documents may be required based on current biosecurity climate.

HITS follows a strict biosecurity protocol. The effectiveness of our protocol depends on exhibitor's adherence to the biosecurity rules and communication with show management and official show veterinarian. Participants are expected to notify management immediately of any signs of an ill horse. Per GR873 any horse with a temperature of 101.5+ must be reported to official show veterinarian. Upon veterinary examination, if diagnostic testing is deemed necessary, testing will be conducted at owner's expense. If veterinarian suspects infectious disease after inspection, the horse will be required to go to isolation or off the property.

DRUG TESTING: State of California drug testing rules apply. For a copy contact the Show Office.

ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP & FEE REQUIREMENTS

• Owner-Rider-Trainer: Must be ACTIVE COMPETING members of USEF and USHJA, or join at the show, or pay Show Pass fees. Note: Owners and Riders are limited to ONE USEF Showpass per competition year, Trainers MUST be members. USEF showpasses must be purchased through the individual's USEF account.

• Adult or Amateur Status: Riders showing in classes restricted to Adults or Amateurs must have USEF Amateur Certification. Foreign Exhibitors must present documentation indicating their Amateur status with their home Federation and must JOIN USEF as ACTIVE COMPETING Members and Sign for Amateur Status.

• Safe Sport: Beginning January 1, 2019, All Senior members of USEF will be required to complete Safe Sport training at USEF.org before competing in a USEF Licensed competition. An exhibitor will not be allowed to compete until this requirement is met.

• International Riders: All classes held during the 2026 HITS Del Mar Series will be run under National rules with regard to riders. If the capacity of International riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a First come, First served basis. All International Riders must have an active, competing USEF and USHJA membership, as well as having completed SafeSport Training for Riders 18 and Older.

Reminder: USEF MAAP Requirements All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement, to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at USEF.org.

MEMBERSHIP - FARMS & OTHER ENTITIES: Farms, Partnerships, and any entities owning a horse competing in a USEF Licensed Competition must be Recorded with USEF, and one recorded owner of the entity must have a current USEF and USHJA Competing Membership.

MEMBERSHIP - HORSES

• USHJA Horse Registrations: All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Equitation competitions must have or apply for a Registration Number from USHJA

• USEF Horse Recording: Horses earning points toward USEF HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards, USHJA Hunter Derby and or competing in Grand Prix must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life.

• Microchip: Beginning December 1, 2018, all horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Equitation competitions must have a USEF-approved Microchip on file with USEF and USHJA. Horses will not be allowed to compete until this requirement is met.

• Measurement Card: Small Junior Hunters, Pony Hunters, Children's Pony Hunters, and Pony Jumpers must have valid USEF Measurement Card or copy of a valid Measurement Form, or be a measured at the show prior to showing. Foreign Measurement cards are not acceptable as proof of Measurement.

MEMBERSHIP HORSE FEES:

- **Horse Fee:** USEF \$10, USHJA \$10

- **Horse Drug Fee:** USEF \$15 CDFA \$14

- **High Performance Fees:** Horses entered in Grand Prix are required to pay the \$35 IHP Fee up to a total of the cap \$420 per competition year. Please refer to the USEF website for additional information.

THE SHOW SECRETARY WILL NOT ISSUE A NUMBER TO ANY EXHIBITOR UNTIL ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS HAVE BEEN MET. ONCE THE NUMBER IS ISSUED, ASSOCIATION FEES, INCLUDING SHOW PASS FEES, WILL NOT BE ADJUSTED FOR THAT SHOW. Failure to provide proper credentials will result in show pass fees and/or Incomplete Entry fees charged in each incident.

The Exhibitor has the ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider and trainer with USEF/USHJA and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are concerned.

HELMET RULE: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee, Competition Management, and Licensed Officials must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

GOLF CARTS & BICYCLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PARKING: Parking allowed in designated areas only. Violators parked in NO PARKING ZONES and FIRE LANES will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the owner's expense. There are Handicap parking areas in the Stable Area and public parking lot.

INSURANCE: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their animals. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

FOOD: Food will be available for purchase in the Food Court.

NON SMOKING EVENT: The events included in this prize list are non smoking events in accordance with California State Law SB-977 Tobacco: youth sports events.

RAIN: In the event of rain prior to the Show, it is the riders' responsibility to call Show Management to determine whether the show is canceled.

RESPONSIBILITY OF PAYMENT OF SERVICES & SUPPLIES: All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their animals, agents, or employees, to stalls, buildings and other properties on the Show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the Show. Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed/bedding bills from premium money due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting his obligations to the official Show Veterinarian, farrier and feed/bedding vendor will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in any ring where a course is set unless otherwise given permission from management, or when there is equipment in the ring. Please check with the show office for information regarding schooling policies. Horses and riders must yield immediately for watering and dragging. Violations of the above mentioned rules may be considered cause for elimination from the show.

RING INFORMATION: All warm up and competitions arenas contain either geotextile or sand footing. Dimensions are: Grand Prix Ring (grass footing) 250' X 300', Hunter Rings and additional jumper rings 130' X 290', Warm Up rings 150' X 200'.

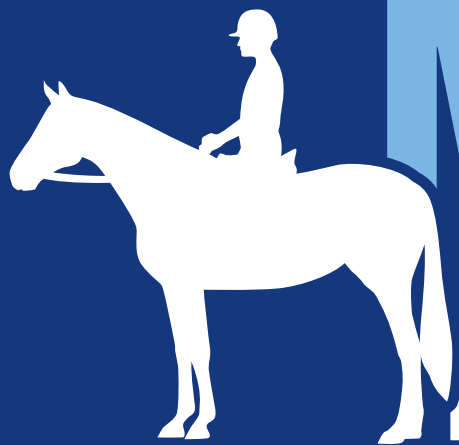
