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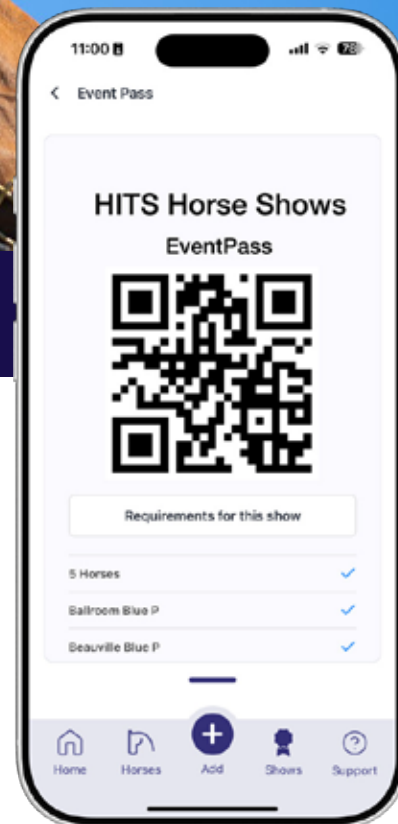

Under this Program, any horse 7-Years Old or under may show in up to three "open" jumper classes at .65m-1.30m, and have the class fees waived for those classes. See details below. This is in addition to the Young Jumper 5-, 6- and 7-Year Old Jumper Classes that are already offered with a free entry fee. Horses will be eligible to receive Prize Money in classes that offer it. Special Classes, Classics, or classes restricted to Juniors, Amateurs, Child or Adult riders are not included in the program. Exception: a class shown "hors concours" will be eligible for the Program, but prize money will not be paid. Hunter and Equitation classes will not count for this program, and will not be credited.

Horses must be age verified with USEF to participate in this program.

Horses must be declared for the Young Jumper Program online upon entering the show. At checkout, Exhibitors must review accounts with the Show Office for class credits. Horses will be credited for the class fees for the three lowest priced classes eligible for the program. Example: if the horse shows in three "Non-Nominated" jumper classes, and one "Nominated" jumper class, the three "Non-Nominated" classes will be credited. The Show office is not responsible for credits not issued for horses whose accounts are not closed out in the Show Office, or by email or remote method. Horses not declared for the Young Jumper program when submitted online will not be eligible to have their class fees credited.

Horses will be charged for any Stalls, All Inclusive Facility Fee, USEF/USHJA Horse/Drug Fees, Nomination Fees and any other Association Fees (Showpass fees, Horse or Owner/Rider/Trainer Membership fees, etc.), any Feed/Bedding, Paddocks, RV's, Restaurant Charges, and any other Miscellaneous Fees (Shoeing, Vet, Post Entry Fee, etc.), and any entry or nominating fees for classes beyond the three eligible classes showed in.

The Young Jumper Development program is open to all competing horses aged 7 and under. Nomination Fees will not be credited. This Program is not offered during Hudson Valley Spring Classic.

Any questions or discrepancies not covered herein will be decided by Show Management, its decision to be final. Updates may made to this policy as needed. ***Young Jumper classes do not count towards USHJA Young Jumper Points.***

CONDITIONS & SPECIFICATIONS

ELIGIBILITY: Horses/ponies, riders, and owners (or lessee) must be an USHJA and USEF Active Competing member. The team challenge is open to riders from all Zones. All horses and riders are eligible for USHJA Zone HOTY points regardless of whether the owner or rider resides within the zone where the Championship is held. Three fence heights will be offered: 1. 3'0" Children's and Adult Amateur Hunter 2. 2'6" Low Children's and Adult Hunter, Large Children's Pony Hunter 3. 2'0" Small/Medium Children's Pony Hunter. Riders must enter the USHJA Hunt and Go Team Challenge a minimum of two hours prior to the start of the Team Challenge. Formal attire is required. Colors will be designated to differentiate teams. Riders are allowed to wear their team color throughout the Hunt and Go Team Challenge competition. Riders are only allowed to compete on one (1) horse/pony in the Hunt and Go Team Challenge. Open to Junior and Adult Amateur riders. Professionals are not eligible to compete in the Hunt and Go Team Challenges. Riders entered in the Hunt and Go Team Challenge may not cross enter any class where fences exceed 3'9" at the same competition.

TEAMS: Teams will consist of a maximum of four (4) and minimum of three (3) horse/pony-and-rider combinations. Teams are determined by random draw. The construction of teams starts by filling each team with one horse/pony from each section with as many entered as teams, so each team has an even number from the sections. 1. The first teams to be created are three (3) rider teams. 2. Remaining riders after the random team creation draw, will be randomly assigned to a team. If a rider scratches after the team draw, a four (4) rider team will become a three (3) rider team system. If a rider scratches from a three (3) rider team before the start of the competition, riders will be randomly redistributed.

FORMAT: The class must be held as a one-round, two-phase, Hunt and Go course at each respective height. **The Classic Phase** will consist of five to seven fences, and shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. After the completion of the classic round, horses/ponies will pick up their pace, pass through a set of markers to being their handy portion of the class. **The Handy Hunter Phase** must consist of five to seven fences, and should be designed as an introduction to Handy courses. It is encouraged that the course include a bending line, roll back turn and trot fence. There will be no high options in any height section. To be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. Decorations may not jump decorations or other obstacles to create a shorter track.

SCORING: A rider will receive a Classic Phase numerical score and a Handy Phase numerical score from their Hunt and Go round. That judge will provide a single numeric score (0-100) for each phase (Classic and Handy). For a four-man team, the lowest team member score in each phase will be dropped. Three-man teams will drop the lowest score and duplicate the middle score in each phase. Team Scores will be determined by adding each phase's Overall Score. The Judge will be required to score all riders in an open numerical scoring system.

OVERALL CHAMPION TEAM: The Champion Team is the team with the highest Team Score after the completion of the class. Tie-Breaking: the team with the highest combined score from the Handy Phase will break the tie. If the teams have the same combined score in the Handy, the rider with the most points from each team will answer a tie-breaking question from the USHJA Horsemanship Quiz.

AWARDS: Ribbons & Prize Money will be awarded to the 1st through 8th placed teams. Prize Money will be divided among team members

Phase 2 – Under Saddle: To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance and soundness. Manners and suitability of pony to rider shall be emphasized. No more than 12 ponies to be shown at one time. Score to count 30%.

Phase 3 – Over Fences: To be shown over a course of 8-10 fences at the required height. To be judged on performance and soundness. Manners and suitability of pony to rider shall be emphasized. Fences 2' for Small/Medium, 2'6" for Large. Score to count 50%.

JUDGING: In the Model and Under Saddle phase, each pony will receive a numerical score. The Over Fences phase will be judged under the Open Numerical judging system and scores will be announced.

SCORING: Scores to count 20% Model; 30% Under Saddle; 50% Over Fences. In the case of a tie for any Overall Awards, the Over Fences score shall be used to break the tie.

ORDER OF GO: The groupings for the Model and Under Saddle to be randomly drawn. The order for the Over Fences Phase to be reverse order of the standings after Phases 1 and 2.

SPECIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS: To be shown by a Junior Exhibitor. The same Junior Exhibitor must handle the pony in all three phases. The handler/rider at the Finals need not have handled/shown the pony at any previous competition. The same Junior Exhibitor may show only one pony in each section, but may ride a Small, Medium and Large pony in the competition. Only the Competition Rider may ride the pony beginning at 5 pm the day before the competition until the conclusion of the competition. Exception: The pony, with another rider, may compete in Beginner and Advanced Beginner Equitation only. Competition number must be worn at all times, and pony may only be ridden in the designated areas. There will be a Riders Meeting on Friday. Time and location to be determined.

QUALIFYING PERIOD - The 2026 HITS Adult Equitation Championship will be held the week of HITS Hudson Valley VII. The class will be open to Adult Amateur riders who will need to qualify (see Qualifying Criteria below). The qualifying period will be from December 1, 2025 through August 26, 2026 (the first day of HITS Hudson Valley VII).

QUALIFYING CRITERIA - To qualify in 2026, riders will need to have placed first, second, or third in one of the following USEF-rated classes held at any National or Premier USEF show during the Qualifying Period:

- Any 3' USEF Adult Age Group Equitation Class
- Ariat Adult Medal
- USEF Adult Medal
- The League Adult Medal (in 2025 Dover Adult Medal)
- The League Jr/Amateur Horsemanship
- NEHC Adult Medal
- USHJA Adult Jumper Seat Medal

REQUIREMENTS - Competitors must present horses for an official jog prior to the start of the competition.

The class will be judged as an Equitation Class. Fences will be set at 3' for all jumping phases. The class will be judged by one panel of 2 judges who will be chosen by HITS management. The panel will give one score per rider. The class will consist of three (3) phases and a ride-off to be held over 2 days. Open numerical scoring between 0-100 will be given for each phase, except for the final testing phase which will be scored and added to the total, but not announced.

Each phase of Phases 1-3 will count equally. The top four riders with the highest combined numerical scores from the first three phases, and any competitor with a cumulative score within 3 points of the leader will return for further testing. Testing will be determined by the Judges using EQ113 (tests 1 -23). Scores for the Ride-Off will be added to each rider's cumulative score from Phases 1-3.

DAY 1: Class 901 - Phase 1: Equitation Round over classic hunter-style fences of 10-12 jumping efforts

Class 902 - Phase 2: Equitation on the Flat, groups of no more than 10-12 horses.

Flat sections will be determined by random draw.

DAY 2: Class 903 - Phase 3: Equitation Round over Handy Hunter type course of at least ten (10) jumps. Handiness and brilliance to be rewarded. Riders will return for the Handy Hunter Round in reverse order of combined scores from Phases 1 & 2.

Class 904 - Ride-Off: The top four riders with the highest combined numerical scores from the first 3 phases and any competitor within 3 points of the leader will return in reverse order of scores for further testing determined by the judges using USEF EQ 113 tests 1-23. The Ride-Off will be judged and a final numeric score will be added to each competitor's total but will not be publicly announced until the awards are presented. The class will be pinned in reverse order.

Entry Fee \$100

The Arion Equitation Championship class is open to Junior & Young riders in good standing with USEF. Only one rider per horse and the same horse must be used for all phases. A substitute horse may be used if the change of horse happens prior to Round 1. Trainers are permitted to assist in schooling, including walking the course with their riders.

FORMAT: The Championship Class consists of two Rounds. The top 65% of riders from Round 1 will return to compete in Round 2. Each round will be scored using the open numeric system. Scores from Round 1 and Round 2 will be added together. If there is more than one panel for Rounds 1 and 2, the rider's score for the Round will be the total of both panels. The Top 4 riders and any rider with a total score from Rounds 1 and 2 that is within 3 points of the leader will be subject to mandatory additional testing (maximum of 8). Judges shall determine the additional testing requirements using USEF Tests 1-23; 2 or more tests must be incorporated into the additional testing phase. Riders will be tested in reverse order, low score to high score. Each rider in the testing phase will be given a numerical score, which will not be announced until the awards ceremony, that will be added to their total score from Rounds 1 and 2. All phases will count equally. If more than one panel of judges is used, the judges will sit together for the additional testing phase.

ROUND 1: Each rider will compete individually over an equitation-style course of jumps not to exceed 3'6" and must include 2 changes of direction after the first jump and include a combination. The course must also include at least 3 of the following: a bending line, a narrow jump, a roll-back turn, a fence at the end of the ring, a long approach to a single, or an option jump. Course may include a Liverpool as part of an option jump. Emphasis will be placed in riding style, technique, accuracy and smoothness in completing the course.

ROUND 2: Each rider will compete individually over a gymnastic-style course of jumps not to exceed 3'6". This class will be jumped under traditional equitation standards. In addition, two or more USEF Tests (choosing from 2, 8, 10, 12, 16, 17, 18, 20) must be included in the course.

SCORING: For Round 1 and Round 2, two judges sitting together or 2 panels of judges who will sit apart and use the open numeric system for scoring. If there is more than one panel for Rounds 1 and 2, the rider's score for the Round will be the total of both panels. Riders' scores will be added together from Rounds 1 and 2 to determine the Top 4 and any additional riders that would be required to test. 2 Refusals will be cause for elimination. A rider who receives a zero in any round is not eliminated from overall consideration.

TIES: For competitors involved in additional testing, overall ties from Round 1 and 2 will be broken by the judges. In the event of an overall tie for riders not included in the work-off, the rider with the highest score in Round 2 will receive the higher overall placing.

SCHOOLING RULES: 30 minutes prior to the start of this class, and throughout the class, riders may only school in the designated schooling area for this Championship. Any conflicts should be discussed with the Schooling Supervisor prior to the start of the round. The Schooling Ring will follow USEF Jumper Schooling Rules per Appendix A. Jumps in the schooling area may be flagged and the flags may be changed. Additional schooling will be permitted for those involved in any additional testing.

ORDER OF GO: First Round order of go will be drawn. Top 65% of competitors will return for Round 2 in reverse order (Low to high scores).

AWARDS: Overall ribbons and awards will be given to 12th place. Awards will be presented after the additional work-off. Riders are required to be mounted for the awards. Special awards will be given to the top three finishers.

EQUIPMENT: Tack allowed per USEF EQ 106.5b.1,2,3. Change of tack is permissible between phases.

TRAINER BONUS: A bonus of \$25,000 will be awarded to the top trainer in the Arion Equitation Classic.





\$300,000 3'6" OPEN CLIPMYHORSE.TV HUNTER CLASSIC

All qualifying classes will be stand-alone and will consist of a 3'6" hunter course and be judged by a single judge on a score of 1-100. Riders may enter more than one horse in the qualifying events. There must be at least six entries in a qualifying event for it to count for qualifying for the Final. A rider can only qualify once. If a rider who is already qualified rides in a subsequent qualifying class and places 1-3, the next placed unqualified rider in the class (4th place, etc) will qualify for the Final. If a rider places in the top three with more than one horse at a single qualifying event (i.e., places 1st and 3rd), that rider will qualify for the Final and the next placed unqualified rider (4th or 5th, etc) in that class will also qualify for the Final.

24 riders will qualify by placing first, second or third at one of the eight qualifying classes listed below. The 2025 winner of the ClipMyHorse.TV Hunter Classic automatically qualifies, and will be the 25th qualified rider.

Qualifying classes are open to all junior and amateur riders who pay the \$250 one-time annual nomination fee and enter the class. The entry fee for each qualifying class will be \$50. All qualifying classes will be an overlay with the 3' Adult or 3' Child Classic held at the designated qualifying show and will consist of the score from the first round only of the Classic. There must be at least six entries in each overlay class for it to count for qualifying for the Final. Riders may enter more than one horse in a qualifying class, but will receive qualifying points only for their highest placed horse in the class. Each rider can use their points from up to four of the eight qualifying classes. Restrictions on a rider jumping higher heights at the show will follow that show's Zone rules for the 3' Adult and 3' Child Classics.

The top 20 Junior Riders and top 20 Amateur Riders based on the rider's cumulative points from their best four qualifying classes will qualify to ride in the Finals. Riders with tied points will all qualify. If a qualified rider does not enter the Final, Management has the option to replace the rider with the next highest placing rider to keep the Final at 20 riders. In year two (2027) and future years, the prior year's winner of the Junior Rider and winner of the Amateur Rider Finals will automatically qualify, making 21 riders in each of the Finals (more if tied).

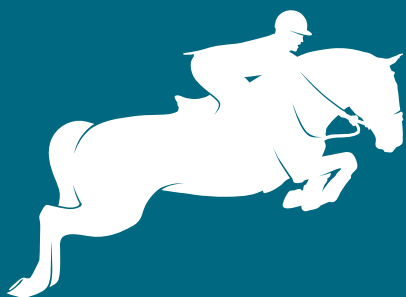
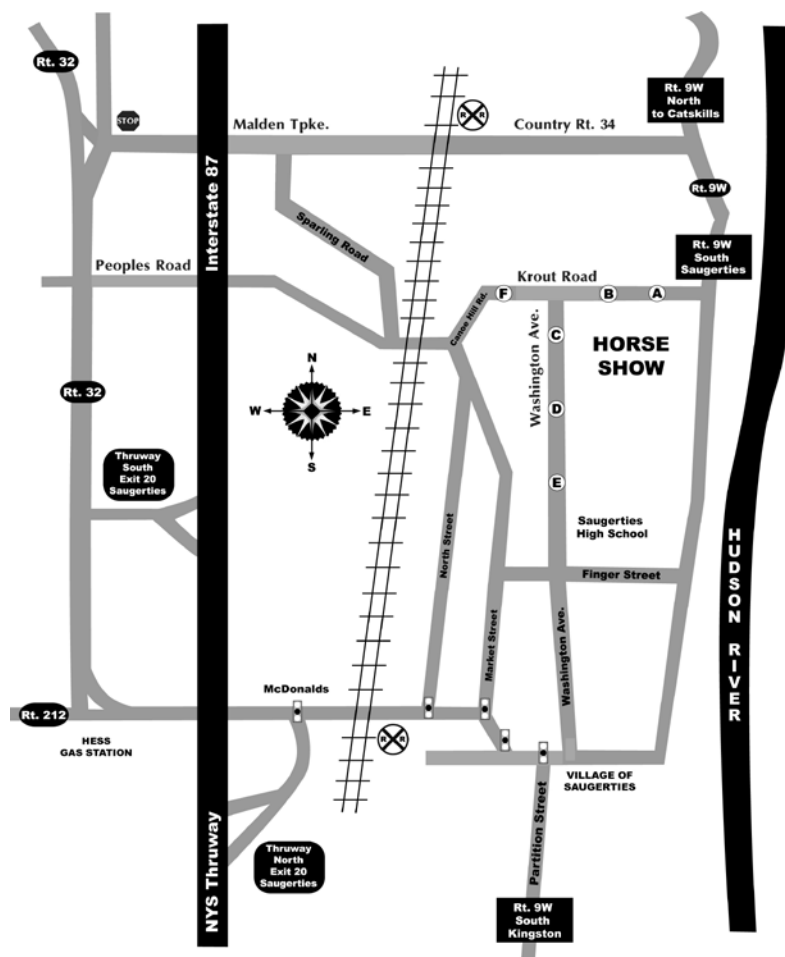

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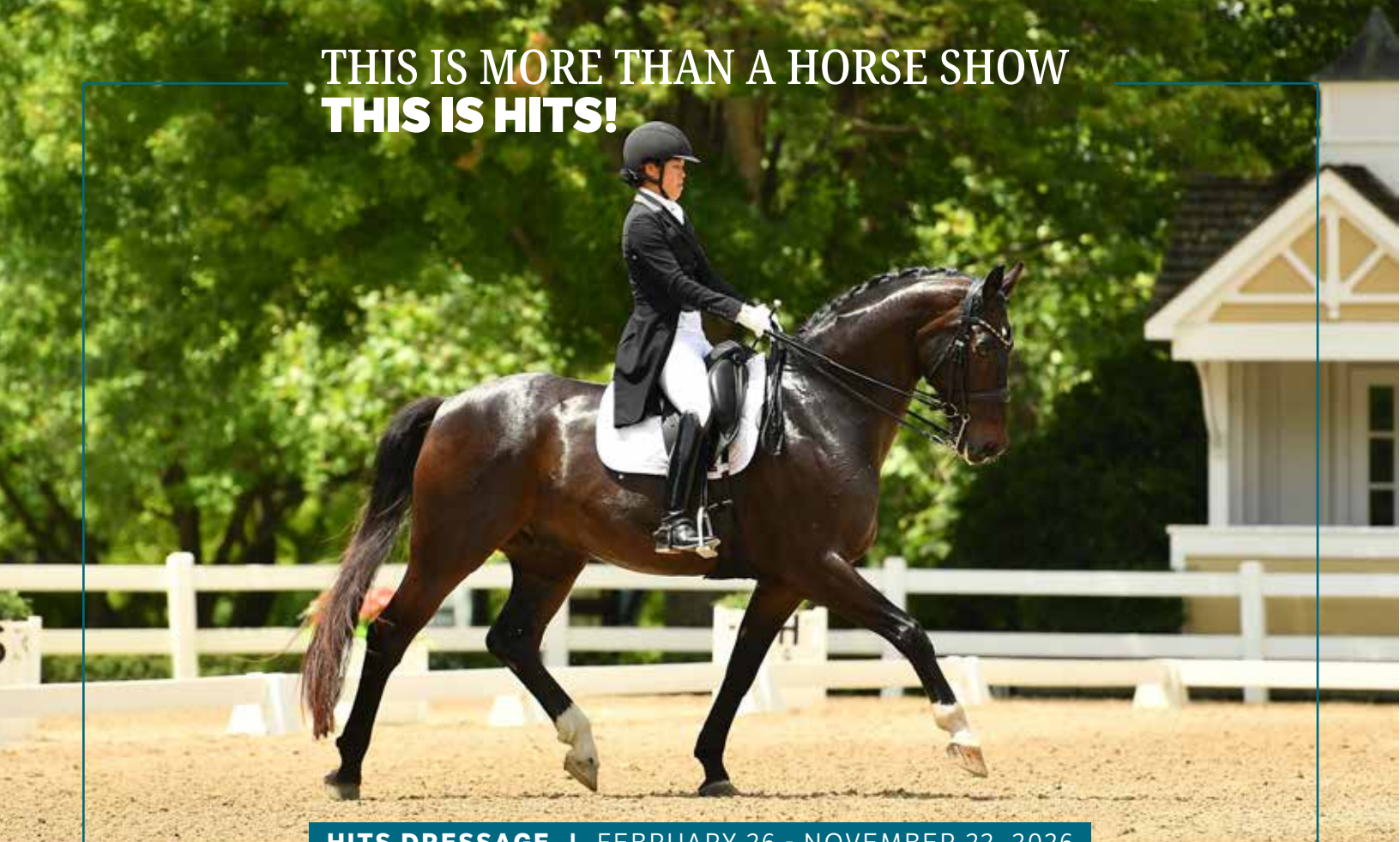

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Federation Entry Agreement

Before you arrive,

HERE ARE A FEW REMINDERS ABOUT THE BEST WAYS YOU CAN KEEP YOUR HORSES SAFE & HEALTHY

- **Temperature Monitoring:** Twice daily temperature monitoring is highly encouraged while on the competition grounds and management will provide temp logs upon request. In the event of elevated disease risk or an infectious disease incursion, management will notify competitors of mandatory twice daily temperature monitoring and recording (ideally 12 hours apart and prior to any temperature-reducing medication (i.e. Bute or Banamine). Temperature logs will be provided for placement on the stall door for recording temperatures.
- **Limit Horse-to-Horse Contact:** Direct contact between horses from different home facilities should be minimized, and horse-to-human contact between facilities should be limited.
- **Avoid Shared Equipment or Water Sources.** Do not share equipment between horses, and do not use communal water sources. Make sure horses have their own buckets, feed pans, grooming equipment, and rags, and limit or eliminate other equipment that touches more than one horse. Fill water buckets without submerging the hose in the buckets.
- **Reporting a Febrile Horse:** Any horse with a temperature over 101.5F is required to be reported immediately to the official veterinarian, who will examine the horse to determine the next steps, and to horse show management. Any horse suspected of having an infectious disease will be required to immediately enter isolation stabling or be removed from the property.
- **Reporting a Sick Horse:** Report any horse with observable signs of illness, including, but not limited to, nasal discharge, abnormal gait, change in feed or water consumption, or change in behavior to the official veterinarian and show management.

- The official veterinarians for these events are listed below, and are available during this event to take reports of fevers or illness.

IF AN INFECTIOUS DISEASE IS SUSPECTED

- **The official veterinarian** may require a potentially sick horse to be tested for infectious disease at the owner's expense. If the owner/trainer chooses not to submit to testing, the horse may be asked to leave the competition venue.
- **Per USEF requirements**, we have a biosecurity plan in place for where and how to isolate any potentially sick or exposed horses, and we will work closely with state animal health officials to assist with contact tracing and any additional health and safety measures they require.
- **Failure to Comply with Biosecurity Measures:** Individuals who fail to comply with any biosecurity requirements will be reported to USEF for enforcement action and may be removed from the premises.

EQUINE HEALTH & ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Protecting the health of your horse and other horses is of the utmost importance to HITS. Beginning in 2013, HITS implemented Required Biosecurity Measures to decrease the risk of introduction and/ or spread of contagious or infectious disease at its shows.

Horses must arrive only between the hours of 8 am-5 pm daily. Off-hours arrival must obtain permission from Show Management.

UPON ARRIVAL ALL HORSES MUST HAVE & PROVIDE

NEGATIVE COGGINS REQUIRED DATED WITHIN TWELVE MONTHS

Valid within (365 days) of the ending date of each show. This includes horses that originate from the state where the event is being held. All horses entering the Show Grounds must have a Negative Coggins on file. Coggins must reflect the horse's SHOW NAME.

PROOF OF VACCINATION

Via a signed statement from the attending veterinarian that the horse has been vaccinated against the following:

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Equine Influenza

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: EHV 1 and EHV 4

If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number for that show.

HEALTH CERTIFICATE/CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION

Vermont & Virginia Only

The Vermont Agency of Agriculture and Virginia of Agriculture and Consumer Services require each horse originating from out of state to have a valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Certificate) dated within 30 days of entry into Vermont or Virginia. For Vermont ONLY the following address must be listed as the Premises of Destination: Vermont Summer Festival, 3028 Route 7, East Dorset, VT 05253.

PRESENTATION OF HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. The Equine Health Requirements are Required for all horses entering the Show Grounds both Showing and Non Showing. To ensure the safety of all horses competing at HITS managed venues, the following documentation must be uploaded through **EquiTrace EventPass** prior to on-site arrival. Each horse entering the show grounds is required to have a negative coggins (within a year) and proof of Flu/ Rhino and EHV 1/4 vaccinations (within 6 months). Additional documents may be required based on current biosecurity climate.

HITS follows a strict biosecurity protocol. The effectiveness of our protocol depends on exhibitor's adherence to the biosecurity rules and communication with show management and official show veterinarian. Participants are expected to notify management immediately of any signs of an ill horse. Per GR873 any horse with a temperature of 101.5+ must be reported to official show veterinarian. Upon veterinary examination, if diagnostic testing is deemed necessary, testing will be conducted at owner's expense. If veterinarian suspects infectious disease after inspection, the horse will be required to go to isolation or off the property.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded to eighth place in all Hunter and Jumper classes unless otherwise noted. Prize Money is awarded to sixth place in Hunter classes and sixth or eighth place in Jumper classes.

International Riders: All classes held during the 2026 HITS Hudson Valley Circuit will be held under National rules with regard to riders. If the capacity of International Riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. All International Riders must have an active, competing USEF and USHJA Memberships as well as having completed SafeSport Training for Riders 18 and Older.

Secure Stabling: The 24-hour stabling rule will be in effect for all Hunter and Jumper classes offering prize money of \$25,000 or more, and for all USHJA International Derbies. Horses must purchase a stall from HITS and reside on the grounds for the 24-hour period prior to the class. Check-in for Grand Prix horses may require the horse to be presented to HITS staff 24 hours prior to each Grand Prix at a location to be determined.

HJ106.2: All horses regardless of show or non-showing are required to submit an entry with the Horse Show Office and wear or display the back number at all times. Any horse without a back number or with an incorrect back number will be asked to leave the area.

Longeing: Horses must be longed in the official longeing areas only. All horses must wear, or be accompanied with a visible entry number. No chasing, whip cracking, or plastic bags on whips. Stirrups may not hang from the saddle while longeing. Dangerous horses will not be permitted, and will be asked to leave. No phones or radios.

HUNTERS

Jog: Jogging will be conducted under HU118.3, Option A: Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. The following sections will not jog: Children's, Adult, Hi-Low, Schooling, Baby Green, Young, Thoroughbred Hunter, Modified Junior/Amateur, Modified Children's/Adult, Pre-Children's/Adult, Novice Child/Adult, Saugerties Child/Adult, Short Stirrup, Schooling Pony, Green Schooling Pony.

Warm-Up: Ticketed warm-up schedule will be posted in the Show Office and online. Tickets are \$40 each and will be billed to the back number worn at the ring.

Schooling is prohibited in the show rings.

2026 Zone 2 Specifications: (Check USHJA.org for the most updated specs.)

- **Adult Amateur Hunter:** To be shown by Adult Amateur Riders. Ponies may be shown by Adults, suitability to count. Rider Restrictions: Riders may not compete in any other class at the same show where fence height exceeds 3'6" except Adult Amateur Jumper and USEF Talent Search. Riders may cross enter between Adult Amateur and Amateur-Owner Hunter 3'3"/3'6" only if the rider owns the horse he/she is showing in the Adult Amateur division. Horses, with a different rider, may show in any other class or division at the same show except Amateur-Owner Hunter. Fences 3'; spreads not to exceed fence height.
- **Children's Hunter:** To be shown by Junior Exhibitors. Riders may not compete in any other class at the same show where fence height exceeds 3' except Children's Jumper, Pony Jumper, USHJA National Derby and Equitation Classes not exceeding 3'6". Riders may cross enter between Children's Hunter Horse and Regular or Green Pony Hunter, but may NOT cross enter between Children's Hunter Pony and Regular or Green Pony Hunter. Horses may not cross enter into the Junior Hunter Division; Ponies may not cross enter into the Regular or Green Pony Hunter Division. Fence heights 3' for horses; 2'6" for large ponies; 2' for small and medium Ponies.

Amateur Jumper: Amateurs may compete up to two horses, they do not own, per height section of Amateur Jumpers per competition. There is no limit on the number of horses that may be ridden by the owner or an amateur member of the owner's family.

Declarations: Nominated Jumpers must declare on the appropriate form in the Show Office the day before the class is to be held by online or in the show office by 4 pm. Late declarations will be subject to the Post Entry Penalty and may require the horse to work first in the order. Classes entered on the Entry Blank constitute a Declaration.

Jumper Tables: Refer to the Time Schedule.

Time Allowed: The Time Allowed will be based on a speed of 360 yards per minute for Pony Jumpers, and 382 yards per minute for all other sections unless otherwise noted, and may be adjusted accordingly.

Draw Reins/German Martingales: Draw reins and German martingale may not be used in any competition/class restricted to Ponies, Juniors, and/or Amateurs, or by age of horse. Draw reins and German martingales may only be used in a conventional manner when schooling or in classes with no prize money that are offered at 1.20m or below. Draw reins and/or German martingales may not be used on Ponies at any time when ridden by a Junior. No other head set devices (chambon, etc.) are permitted in any class.

2026 Zone 2 Specifications: (Check USHJA.org for the most updated specs.)

- **Jr/Am 1.0m-1.05m & Jr/Am 1.10m-1.15m Jumper:** Open to Juniors and Amateurs on horses and ponies. Jr/Am 1.0m-1.05m riders may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m at the same competition. Jr/Am 1.10m-1.15m riders may not cross enter into the Jr/Am 1.40m or any other jumper class exceeding 1.30m at the same competition with the exception of classes which do not offer prize money. Horse/Rider combinations may cross enter between the Jr/Am 1.0m-1.05m and the Jr/Am 1.10m-1.15m Jumper at the same competition.

SPECIAL CLASSES - The General Rules and Regulations of the Horse Show will prevail for the Special Classes except as provided for each individual class and as noted herein.

Grand Prix

- **Specs:** Table II.2.a. National Standard.
- **Horse Limit:** Riders are not limited to the number of horses they may ride.
- **Ranking List Points:** Riders are no longer required to designate a "Point Horse" effective December 1, 2014. Riders will receive Ranking Points from the placing points earned on his/her highest placed horse. *Please visit Ryegate.com/USSET.php Upcoming Classes to determine which classes will be included in the Rolex Computer Ranking List.*

The League presented by M+S Insurance

- **Classic Riders:** The League membership is required for points to count for classics and classes that are affiliated with the The League presented by M+S Insurance.
- **Wild Card:** The top two finishers in each Wild Card who are not already qualified will receive automatic invitations to The League Finals in the respective division. Riders must be 2026 members of the League in order to compete. If applying for membership at the show, a rider must join for 2026 and 2027.

Special Hunter Classics: Judged on performance and soundness with manners and suitability emphasized. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. The top 12 (or 1/2) horses (ponies) from the first round will return to jump a second round in reverse order of their scores in the first round; lowest score going first and highest score going last. In case of ties, order of those tied will be drawn. Scores will be averaged from both rounds to determine the winners. In case of a tie for first place only, judges will confer to break the tie. All other ties will remain and riders will toss a coin for the ribbons.

- **Separate Two Round Classic:** For the first round, each competitor will jump one round of approximately 10-12 fences at the required height.
- **Designated First Round Classic:** A Designated Class of the Division will be the first round of the Classic. **You must enter the Classic before competing in the First Round Class.** Scratches are not permitted after the first Round Class has begun. Any horse shown in the Second Round of a Classic without being officially entered will be charged the classic Post Entry Fee. See Time Schedule for Designated First Round Class.

Special Class Nomination/Declaration: Special Classes entered on the initial entry constitute a Declaration. Horses must be entered the day before the class or pay the Special Class Post Entry Fee.

Special Class Scratch: Any scratch must be made before the class starts or be accompanied by a Vet's Certificate. See "Rules & Regulations" for more details. In the event of a scratch on the day of the class, horses are subject to the Special Class Scratch Fee.

Order of Go: The Order of Go will be drawn. In the jump-off, if any, all horses will go in the original drawn order.

Attire: Formal attire required in Special Classes.

Awards: Winners to ride for presentation of awards in Special Classes.

Trophy & Ribbons: 1-12 in Special Classes unless otherwise stated.

Show Champion or Circuit Champion: Classics will not count toward Show or Circuit Champion Awards.

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GENERAL INFORMATION, RULES & REGULATIONS

• CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION •

Every class offered herein that is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

• USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT •

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of HITS Hudson Valley. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR9074. If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber and competing only in classes that are exempt from membership requirements, I acknowledge and agree that I will be enrolled at no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew unless and until USEF determines in its sole discretion to terminate my Fan account. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733. BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at USEF.org, as amended from time to time, as well as all terms and provisions of this Prize List. If I am signing and submitting this Agreement electronically, I acknowledge that my electronic signature shall have the same validity, force and effect as if I affixed my signature by my own hand.

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants.

Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

ENTRY POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Entries must be submitted electronically through the Show Management System Online Entry platform, and must be filled out in its entirety.
- Horse Deposit Fee will be credited to the horse's entries only if the Entry is received by the Closing Date and meets the Entry Procedure.
- A Signed Open Check or Credit Card Authorization must be lodged with the Show Secretary each week before Numbers are issued.
- Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express are accepted. Customers paying by credit card should reference the Retail pricing.
- Retail prices will be charged for all Credit Card transactions, which as of August 10, 2026 are 3.5% higher than the prices in this Prize List, which is non-refundable once processed.
- Entries received after the Closing Date will be Late and subject to the Post Entry Penalty of \$75.
- Entries received after 5 pm Monday of the show will be subject to the Show Week Post Entry Penalty of \$100.
- Every account must have a valid credit card on file at HITS that will be applied to the entry charges before the back number will be issued. If there is not a credit card on file, to pick up a number a valid signed check made to HITS must be in the show office and will be used to close the account at the end of the show week.
- Accounts must be closed at the end of each show week. Exhibitors are encouraged to close out their account in person. Exhibitors who do not close out in person automatically authorize HITS to close their account using the Check / Credit Card on file.

Billing questions or refunds will not be considered after the show in question.

- Any exhibitor with an unpaid balance after Sunday will be billed for these charges and a \$50 check out fee will be added to the total due.
- Entries will not be permitted to show until previous week balances are closed.
- **An All Inclusive Facility Fee of \$160** will be assessed to all showing horses. This fee entitles the horses to unlimited adds/scratches according to the add/scratch policy (does not apply to Special classes) as well as access to riding and lungeing areas. For Channel II this fee will be \$75.
- **Non-Showing Horse** must be properly entered, wear a back-number and provide coggins and vaccinations and **will be charged a fee of \$50 weekly.**

GOVERNING LAW & VENUE

Any and all disputes related to or arising from HITS' management and/or operation of its horse shows shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York without giving reference to New York's conflict of laws principles. Any disputes that cannot be resolved by the parties shall first be subject to a mediation with a New York chosen mediator. If mediation fails, the parties agree to present to arbitration at HITS' discretion under the American Arbitration Association, and if not Arbitrated, subject to litigation solely in the Courts of Ulster County New York. The parties agree the time limit to object to horse show charges shall be thirty days from the close of the horse show for the week at issue. Any other claims must be brought within one year.

TRAINER'S BARN ACCOUNT

- Trainers must create a "Barn Account" entry to order items (tack stalls, paddocks, RVs, feed & bedding) that they intend to split.
- Trainer's Splits: This service allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until close of business Friday. Only items billed by the Horse Show such as feed, bedding, tack stalls, etc., will be split. Only dollar amounts will be split and totals will be rounded up. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.
- Trainers confirm express authority to charge client's account for trainer split charges (including feed, bedding, groom and tack stall, etc.), and authority to use client's credit card to pay those charges. Trainer agrees to indemnify and hold harmless HITS, LLC and its agents for all such charges and from any dispute arising related to the charges that is brought by client or other person or entity.

REFUNDS

- Refund of pre-paid fees will be given for show scratches received prior to or on the Closing Date Scratch must be made in writing, according to the procedure outlined above.
- Refund for Horse Deposits, Stalls, Paddocks and RV Sites will not be given for entries scratched after the Closing Date. Exhibitors are responsible for any such outstanding fees.
- If eligible for refund, a check for refund due less an office fee of \$25 will be mailed within 30 days after the completion of the final Show of the Circuit.
- Billing questions or requests for refunds will not be considered after the Show in question.

ENTRY CLARIFICATION

- Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number. A Class Number written on the Entry Form, Add Scratch Form, or Barn Add/Scratch Form or submitted online constitutes a Class Entry or Class Declaration.
- An entry with incomplete information for horse, owner, rider or trainer such as a horse entered as "Entry" or "TBA" or any such derivative, will be subject to the \$85 Incomplete Entry Fee. An entry with missing USEF/USHJA or signatures is also subject to this fee.
- Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they have entered to ride. There is no penalty for the rider to scratch an Equitation Class from one horse and add it on another horse. Exhibitors who enter an equitation class on one horse and ride or wear another horse's number will be charged on both horses.
- Any exhibitor who does not compete in a class in which he/she is officially entered, and does not scratch according to the Scratch Procedures outlined below, will be billed for the class.
- Horses shown in a class without being officially entered will be assessed a penalty as shown below.
- Exhibitors are responsible for a knowledge of the Rules and Regulations governing the Horse Show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee, class placing and prize money award.
- Show means the Show Week.
- The Horse Show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912.

ADD/SCRATCH/CHANGE Any class add, scratch, or change, or any complete Show Scratch must be made in writing in the Show office on an official form, or by facsimile, or by letter and received prior to the start of the applicable class or show. Scratching a class "at the gate" is not considered an official scratch. Once a class or division begins, it may not be scratched, except for a Vet Scratch. If a Vet Scratch, the horse must be scratched in the Show office on the day of the class and the Official Show Vet's Certificate must be received that day. Scratch Fee will still apply. A class that has been closed may not be scratched.

- If the SSN/EIN is not provided, Prize Money will be withheld until SSN / EIN is provided.
 - If the IRS has notified us of a discrepancy in Payee name or SSN / EIN prize money will be withheld until the discrepancy is resolved.
 - If an outstanding balance exists on an account, prize money may be withheld.
 - If the SSN/EIN has not been provided to the show office within 90 days of the competition, it will be forfeited. Prize Money will not be reissued after 90 days.
- Prize Money Won by Foreign Exhibitors** is subject to the U.S. Internal Revenue Service regulation requiring sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form W-8BEN prior to receiving prize money.
- **Prize Money** is awarded through 6th place in hunter classes and through 6th or 8th place in jumper classes. A class that pays based on a number of entries will pay based on the number of on-time entries and post entries will not be included in the number used to determine the payout. Special Class Prize Money distribution is published in this book.
 - A class with fewer than three entries will not award prize money.

ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP & FEE REQUIREMENTS

MEMBERSHIP - PEOPLE

• **Owner-Rider-Trainer:** Must be ACTIVE COMPETING members of USEF and USHJA, or join at the show, or pay Show Pass fees. Note: Owners and Riders are limited to ONE USEF Showpass per competition year, Trainers MUST be members.

• **Adult or Amateur Status:** Riders showing in classes restricted to Adults or Amateurs must have USEF Amateur Certification. Foreign Exhibitors must present documentation indicating their Amateur status with their home Federation and must JOIN USEF as ACTIVE COMPETING Members and Sign for Amateur Status.

• **Safe Sport:** Beginning January 1, 2019, All Senior members of USEF will be required to complete Safe Sport training at USEF.org before competing in a USEF Licensed competition. An exhibitor will not be allowed to compete until this requirement is met.

• **International Riders:** All classes held during the 2026 HITS Hudson Valley Series will be run under National rules with regard to riders. If the capacity of International riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a First come, First served basis. All International Riders must have an active, competing USEF and USHJA Memberships as well as having completed SafeSport Training for Riders 18 and Older.

Reminder: USEF MAAP Requirements All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement, to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at USEF.org.

MEMBERSHIP - FARMS & OTHER ENTITIES: : Farms, Partnerships, and any entities owning a horse competing in a USEF Licensed Competition must be Recorded with USEF, and one recorded owner of the entity must have a current USEF and USHJA Competing Memberships.

MEMBERSHIP - HORSES

• **USHJA Horse Registrations:** All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Equitation competitions must have or apply for a Registration Number from USHJA

• **USEF Horse Recording:** Horses earning points toward USEF HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards, USHJA Hunter Derby and or competing in Grand Prix must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life.

• **Microchip:** Beginning December 1, 2018, all horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Equitation competitions must have a USEF-approved Microchip on file with USEF and USHJA. Horses will not be allowed to compete until this requirement is met.

• **Measurement Card:** Small Junior Hunters, Pony Hunters, Children's Pony Hunters, and Pony Jumpers must have valid USEF Measurement Card or copy of a valid Measurement Form, or be a measured at the show prior to showing. Foreign Measurement cards are not acceptable as proof of Measurement.

- **Horse Fee:** USEF \$10, USHJA \$10 (Channel II - USHJA \$5)

ONCE THE NUMBER IS ISSUED, ASSOCIATION FEES, INCLUDING SHOW PASS FEES, WILL NOT BE ADJUSTED FOR THAT SHOW. Failure to provide proper credentials will result in show pass fees and/or Incomplete Entry fees charged in each incident.

The Exhibitor has the ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider and trainer with USEF/USHJA and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are concerned.

Arrival for stabling assignments must be between the hours of 8 am - 5 pm daily. Off-hour arrival allowed only with prior approval of Horse Show Management.

- **Weekly Items** - Stalls can be occupied Monday, 3 pm to the following Monday, 8 am of each Show Week. Arrival prior to Monday at 3 pm will incur a charge for early arrival, and must be organized through the Stabling Manager. Channel II - Arrival Thursday noon.
- Exhibitors staying multiple weeks may occupy their stalls/RVs/Paddocks all day Monday between weeks.

PADDOCKS: Approximately 16 turnout paddocks will be available. Preference will be given to multiple-week reservations. Any horse turned out in a paddock not assigned to the trainer group will incur a weekly charge for the paddock. Exhibitors should notify the Show Office if any part of the their assigned paddock is in need of repair; unless notified, the Horse Show will assume the assigned paddock(s) are deemed safe by the exhibitor, which should be satisfactory for USEF. Each paddock has its own gate and exhibitors should bring their own locks to secure their paddocks. After the closing date of entries, Paddock fees are non-refundable. Paddocks ordered after the closing date of entries will be accepted on a space available basis and may be subject to a Late Paddock fee of \$50 additional per week.

PLEASE NOTE: Bedding on straw is prohibited except when the horse's health is at risk. Prior approval from the Stabling Office is required. Clean-up fee may apply.

SERVICES

- **Feed Store** Hay, grain and bedding may be purchased on the grounds. For deliveries prior to or upon arrival, use the Feed Order form in the prize list or online. Place orders by noon for same day delivery. No deliveries on Sunday. Questions with regard to feed and bedding charges will not be considered after noon Friday. Discrepancies in deliveries will not be considered unless brought to the attention of the Feed Office within 24 hours of placing the order. No commercial feed or bedding source will be permitted to deliver on the show grounds.
- **Horse Watch** Horses stabled on the grounds will receive Horse Watch provided by HITS Staff. Horse Watch extends from approximately 9 pm until 5 am daily. Horses will be checked approximately 5 times a night each night of the Show Week. Trainers/owners should provide emergency contact information for Horse Watch personnel. Forms will be available in the Feed Office or in the Prize List on Feed Order form. Cell phone numbers for Horse Watch will be available in the Feed Office for trainers/owners to be able to contact Horse Watch personnel directly.
- **Trainer's Splits** This service allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on Friday. Only items billed by the horse show such as feed, bedding, tack stalls, etc., will be split. Only dollar amounts will be split and totals will be rounded up. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.
- **Exhibitor Check Cashing** is no longer available. Please make arrangements with local banks.

NON-NEGOTIABLE CHECKS

- **Returned Checks or Credit Cards**, for any reason, will be assessed a penalty of \$50 or 10% of the face value of the check/credit card charge, whichever is greater. Upon notification, exhibitors will have three days to make full payment, including penalty, in certified funds, cashier's check, money order, or credit card. A 3.5% Retail Adjustment will be applied to all Credit Card transactions. Sanctioning organizations will be notified if exhibitors fail to pay in full within three days. A monthly service fee equal to 18% per annum will begin accruing after 30 days. Note First time returned checks will automatically be redeposited.
- A **declined credit card** will be resubmitted within several days.
- A closed account, Stop Payment, incorrect or incomplete credit card information or a chargeback will be turned over to sanctioning organizations immediately.
- **Cash Only** may be required if you have previously given a non-negotiable check to HITS.

PRIZE MONEY

- Prize Money will be applied to entries. The Payee will default to the Owner, if the Prize Money Recipient is not provided on the submitted entry each week. A valid Social Security or Federal ID number and complete mailing address must be provided. If the SSN/EIN has not been provided to the show office within

- **Accidents Involving Competitors** GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until this criteria is met. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this new rule.

- **Protective Headgear** is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Official are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. GR 801.2,7.

- **Motorized Vehicles & Golf Carts.** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. Electric Golf Carts will not be permitted to plug in to any electrical outlet on the grounds.

- **Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds.** Loose dogs will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100. The owner may be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds for a second offense, or for refusal to pay the fine, and will not be entitled to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises.

- **Electrical/Fire Regulations.** Electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse. Additional appliances are not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to confiscation of the item(s).

- **Stall alterations are strictly forbidden.** The removal of stall tent side poles, side ropes and/or stakes/anchors is strictly prohibited. Any exhibitor found in violation will be issued a single warning. If violation continues, Management reserves the right to remove from the show grounds all property belonging to or under the control of said violator. Further, Management reserves the right to bar any exhibitor found to be in violation from any further participation in the horse show without recourse to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due.

- **Stall Customizations:** As part of HITS ongoing commitment to ensure the safety of all participants, particularly the horses in this instance, as well as preserving the integrity of our facilities, we are implementing important updates to our stabling guidelines. These new guidelines apply to all events. We kindly ask for your attention to the following points: Removal of Stall Customizations: Effective immediately, all customizations to the stalls, including but not limited to nails, screws, staples, eye hooks, plastic sheeting, metal wire, twine, and the like must be removed. The use of such materials, especially staples, poses significant risks to the horses and the integrity of our facilities. We strongly recommend the elimination, or at the very least, significant limitation of staples inside the stalls. Our goal is to ensure that all stalls are safe, clean, and in their original condition (minus the bedding). Responsibility of Competitors: It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure that their staff is fully informed of and complies with these updated guidelines. We encourage team leads to hold briefings with their staff to ensure everyone is aware of these changes and understands the importance of adhering to them. Fines for Non-Compliance: In our efforts to maintain the highest standards of facility upkeep and animal safety, HITS will impose a fine of \$500 for stalls that are not left in good condition. This measure is not intended to be punitive, but rather to underscore the importance of leaving the stalls in the same condition as they were found (bedding excluded). We believe this will encourage a collective effort towards maintaining a clean and safe environment for everyone, a form of pay-it-forward to all who utilize our stabling.

- **Damage.** Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

HEALTH & VETERINARY

- **Equine Health Requirements will be enforced.** The Equine Health Requirements are Required for all horses entering the Show Grounds both Showing and Non Showing. To ensure the safety of all horses competing at HITS managed venues, the following documentation must be uploaded through EquiTrace EventPass prior to on-site arrival. Each horse entering the show grounds is required to have a negative coggins (within a year) and proof of Flu/ Rhino and EHV 1/4 vaccinations (within 6 months). Additional documents may be required based on current biosecurity climate.

HITS follows a strict biosecurity protocol. The effectiveness of our protocol depends on exhibitor's adherence to the biosecurity rules and communication with show management and official show veterinarian. Participants are expected to notify management immediately of any signs of an ill horse. Per GR873 any horse with a temperature of 101.5+ must be reported to official show veterinarian. Upon veterinary examination, if diagnostic testing is deemed necessary, testing will be conducted at owner's expense. If veterinarian suspects infectious disease after inspection, the horse will be required to go to isolation or off the property.

- **Sharps & Medical Waste** – Appropriate Sharps Containers for the disposal of used Needles will be placed in all barns and tent stabling areas, at the end of aisles or at the breezeways. Sharps must only be disposed of in these containers. Anyone found in violation of proper disposal or in vandalism or removal of any provided Sharps Container will be fined \$100 and may face further penalties deemed necessary by Show Management. See GR1210.4 for complete details.

- **Show Veterinarian** phone number will be posted at the Show Office.

- **Alcoholic Beverages** in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

PARCEL DELIVERIES: Management will not be responsible for mail or parcel deliveries made to exhibitors, vendors or others. Please make arrangements accordingly.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE: The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands.
This includes good horse management, training methods, farrier and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete.
This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS: The veterinary inspection: will be carried out in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1011, "General Regulations", 21st Edition, 1 January 2005, will apply: In accordance with Art.139.1. Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country, and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have a valid official FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI, accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card, as a means of identification and to establish ownership. In accordance with Art. 139.2. Horses taking part in CNs, and CIMs in their country of residence are not required to have a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, (VET REGS. APPENDIX VI): All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between one and three months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months +21 days, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding seven days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables. The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES, (VET. REGS, CHAP. V & VI AND ANNEX III): Regular sampling is carried out in CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. The number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate, however a minimum of three is recommended (Art. VR 1016). Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Group I & II only).

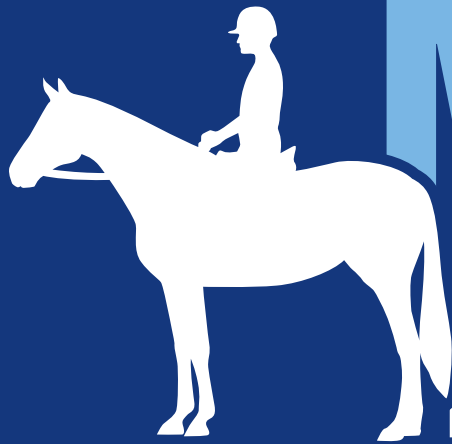
